1992 PRODUCTIVITY SURGES AT RECORD PACE, U.S. CAR SALES WAY UP; **CLINTON MUST AVOID DERAILING BUSH RECOVERY**

WASHINGTON -- SENATE REPUBLICAN LEADER BOB DOLE (R-KANSAS) TODAY ISSUED THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT REGARDING THE PROGRESS OF THE BUSH ECONOMIC RECOVERY:

IT SEEMS THAT EVERY DAY BRINGS NEW EVIDENCE THAT THE BUSH RECOVERY CONTINUES TO ACCELERATE. THE BIG SURGE IN SALES OF AMERICAN-BUILT CARS TO A TWO-YEAR HIGH, COUPLED WITH TODAY'S ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE LABOR DEPARTMENT THAT THE PRODUCTIVITY OF AMERICAN WORKERS JUMPED 2.7 PERCENT IN 1992 -- THE BIGGEST INCREASE IN TWENTY YEARS -- IS MORE GOOD NEWS FOR AN ECONOMY PROPELLED BY THE FINEST WORKERS IN THE WORLD. EVEN THE ASSOCIATED PRESS LABELLED TODAY'S PRODUCTIVITY NEWS AS A "REMARKABLE SURGE."
