DOLE NAMES JANET DORSEY SENATE POSTMASTER

WASHINGTON -- Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole today announced his selection of Janet L. Dorsey to be Postmaster of the United States Senate Post Office beginning in the 104th Congress. Dorsey, a native of Coffeyville, Kansas, has served as the Senate's Deputy Postmaster since 1989.

The Senate Post Office provides mailing services to all Senate offices, including delivery and pickup of constituent mail, and maintains window clerk operations in the Dirksen and Russell Senate Office Buildings. In 1993, the Senate Post Office handled 51 million pieces of mail.

Before joining the Senate Post Office in 1989, Dorsey held positions at agencies including the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, and the Colorado Civil Rights Commission. In 1992, she also served as Special Assistant to the Senate Sergeant at Arms for implementation of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Dorsey was named the Outstanding Federal Disabled Employee of the Year in 1985, and is the founder and past president of the National Handicapped Sports and Recreation Association. Dorsey is a graduate of Kansas State Teachers College in Emporia, Kansas, and Garden City (Kansas) High School.
