Bob Dole, 6th District, Congressman stated today that he and the other 4 Republican Congressmen from Kansas voted against the motion to enlarge the House Rules Committee from 12 to 15 Members - 10 Democrats and 5 Republicans.

He further stated that J. Floyd Breeding, the lone Kansas Democrat in Congress, voted for the Motion which narrowly carried by a vote of 217 to 212.

Dole stated "Enlarging the Committee is a victory for the liberals and socialists and will have the effect of transferring unlimited legislative power to President Kennedy."

Dole added, "Only yesterday, Kennedy in his State of the Union Message stated correctly Congress and the Executive Branch had separate roles in government but today, by virtue of tremendous pressures on individual members, the once powerful Rules Committee has become an open door for socialistic programs Kennedy will have submitted.

Dole predicted "Conservative citizens of Western Kansas, will now witness a parade of legislation advocated by the spenders and power hungry liberals as a result of today's vote."
