Congressman Bob Dole, Republican of Kansas, charged today that section 314 of Title III of the Administration's Omnibus Farm Bill could eventually wipe out independent farm machinery, equipment and farm supply dealers.

Dole explained Section 314, termed by the Administration as a "pilot project" would permit the government to loan money to "non-profit organizations" for the purchase of farming equipment which then would be made available to farmers, presumably by sale or rental.

Dole stated, "The initial authorization for loans would be only \$500,000 but this would be a foot in the door and in a short time it is conceivable free enterprising businessmen dealing in farm machinery, equipment and supplies would be out of business."

This section is completely vague and indefinite but under any interpretation is potentially one of the most dangerous sections in the bill. Dole stated he plans to offer a motion to strike Section 314 from Title III, the Agricultural section of the Omnibus Bill, in Committee hearings today or tomorrow.
