Congressman Bob Dole, 6th District Kansas Republican, today announced that final arrangements have been made for the visit of the Republican "Paul Revere" panel in Kansas next week.

Dole said the panel, headed by Congressman John J. Rhodes, Chairman of the Special Projects Committee of the House Republican Policy Committee, will speak at Salina on the morning of October 25, at Garden City during mid-day and at Hutchinson in the evening of that same day.

The three-man panel, composed of Rhodes, Congressman Jackson Betts of Ohio, and Clifford G. McIntire of Maine, will discuss New Frontier programs, foreign policy, spending, and the trend toward centralization of Government.

Rep. Rhodes, in describing their mission, said, "Nearly two hundred years ago Paul Revere undertook to warn the American colonists of approaching danger. Although our mode of transportation differs, our task and our mission are as important today to the future of our Nation as was Revere's message to the colonists in 1775."

He said, "Something has happened in Washington since January 20. The American people should know about the concerted attack being made on our Constitutional form of Government. We are traveling into the home communities of America to tell them."

Congressman Dole said he would appear with the panel during its tour through the new 1st District.
