Congressman BOB DOLE (R-Kansas) stated as he left Washington, D. C. this afternoon after final adjournment, that

*Person - Dole*  
this was indeed an historic session. Dole stated, "For the first ~~time~~ Congress authorized expenditures of over 100 billion dollars of the taxpayers' money; it was the longest, continuous peacetime session, and it provided a clear illustration of how to move to the rear with the New Frontier."

Dole concluded, "In less than three weeks time before election, I hope to campaign in all the 58 First District counties in an effort to catch up with my opponent who adjourned nearly 30 days ago. In my opinion, the key issues will be my opponent's remarkable records of absenteeism, mishandling of the Cuban situation by this Administration, wild spending programs coupled with repeated requests for more power and authority, and finally, and perhaps the most important western Kansas domestic issue, will be the Kennedy-Freeman-Breeding farm legislation."

Dole said he expected to reach home in time this evening to campaign in Kingman and Anthony and said, "I shall enter the campaign with a clear conscience, having remained until the bitter end of a frustrating and confused session."
