Congressman Bob Dole (R-Kansas) addressed a High School assembly in Liberal this morning (Thursday) and discussed, "fulfilling the demands of freedom in an age of revolution." Dole told the student body there is no reason to expect the future to be one of bliss and comfort because the future, like the present and the recent past, is certain to be full of spectacular changes revolutionary in character. Dole discussed the technological revolution now in progress in the fields of everyday living, such as transportation, communications, medicine, and pointed out there is also a population revolution so rapid that it is regarded as explosive in view of the fact the world's population has increased from 1½ billion at the close of the 19th century to nearly 3 billion today.

Congressman Dole told the High School group that we must sponsor and promote a more vigilant policy with respect to our national defense, for experience has shown that when the enemy talks the sweetest and softest, the danger to our country is all the more menacing. Dole cautioned the group that while everyone wants to be a specialist that in our eagerness to produce specialization, we must not fail to specialize in the most important specialty of all - - the art of living a responsible and meaningful life.

Following the speech to the High School assembly, Dole spent two hours at the Seward County Courthouse visiting with constituents, and then continued the tour of his 58 county district with stops at Courthouses in Sublette and Ulysses.
