\$49,750 FOR KANSAS BICENTENNIAL PROJECTS

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced that the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration has awarded ten grants totalling \$49,750 to Kansas communities. The funds are for use in developing and supporting Bicentennial projects and will be matched by local funds.
