## IMPACT AID MONEY FOR KANSAS

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- Senators Bob Dole and James Perason today announced payment of \$718,258 in Health, Education and Welfare impact aid funds to 36 Kansas school Districts. Dole said the payment represents a portion of the Fiscal Year 1975 entitlement to federally impacted school districts in Kansas.

Such aid -- totalling just over \$8 million state-wide per year -- was made possible last year by a special Dole amendment to the School Lunch Bill in September of 1973. Essentially the same provision was incorporated into the new Education Bill last summer, thus continuing at least temporarily, Kansas' eligibility for assistance. The regulations to implement that law are expected next week, and while there is some concern that the State's so-called "equalization" plan may not qualify for the necessary exemption under the rigid standards being developed, Senator Dole has again indicated that he will "take whatever action is appropriate" to insure that there is no interruption of impact-aid money to the 95 Kansas school districts affected.
