Institutions of higher education in the State of Kansas will receive an additional \$1,181,070 for the operation of College Work-Study Programs in the coming year, Senator Bob Dole announced today. The additional funds are made available through a supplemental appropriations bill recently signed into law by the President.

HEW is encouraging institutions to use 50 percent of the supplemental allocation to establish or expand work-study employment opportunities during the summer months, with the remaining amount to be used to expand work-study employment opportunities for eligible students anytime during fiscal year 1976.

The State of Kansas originally received an allotment for the work-study program of \$2,959,585. The additional funds made available today make the total State allocation \$4,140,655. Participating colleges should receive formal grant awards in the next several weeks but are encouraged to begin new planning for expanded program operations.
