## DOLE TAX CREDIT PROPOSAL PART OF REPUBLICAN ECONOMIC STIMULUS PACKAGE

WASHINGTON, D.C.--A tax credit jobs measure first proposed by Senator Bob Dole nearly a year ago has been incorporated into the Republican economic stimulus package introduced in the Senate today.

"The tax credit jobs program encourages employment in the private, rather than public, sector," Dole said. "It is less expensive and leads to more permanent productive employment. I believe it is preferable to the public works and public service jobs emphasis and am pleased it is being given serious consideration."

The tax credit measure provides a tax benefit to employers who increase jobs during periods of high unemployment. The cost of these new jobs is, therefore, shared by the public and private sectors.
