ARMORY DEDICATED TO WINT SMITH

MANKATO - Senator Bob Dole payed tribute Sunday to Wint Smith as Mankato's National Guard Armory was dedicated to the Kansas Congressman who preceded Dole in the U. S. House of Representatives.

Dole called Smith an "extraordinary man -- one whose good deeds and accomplishment's over six decades of service to his fellow citizens have already insured that his name will be long remembered."

"Wint made a career out of saying exactly what he believed, a fairly novel approach during his time in the Congress," Dole said. "He never missed an opportunity to speak his mind on the key moral and legislative issues facing the nation. And he didn't hesitate to voice his skepticism about the capabilities of the federal government."

The Kansas Senator said it was especially appropriate "to dedicate Mankato's National Guard Armory to the soldier-statesman-patriot who was so instrumental in locating it here. At a time when many of our fellow countrymen would weaken our national defense, we -- the people of Mankato and Kansas -- can be proud that this edifice is to be named in honor of an intensely loyal and patriotic man who understood the need for military strength. Not because we want to rule the world or impose our values on others, but because we want to preserve our liberty."

"Wint Smith understood that. He knew that liberty without strength would not long endure, and that military security without freedom was not worth preserving. That's why he had such a distinguished military career, why he was an outspoken advocate of an America whose strength was second to none. And it is also why a day didn't go by that Wint Smith didn't have a copy of the United States Constitution -- that timeless document that insures our liberty -- in his pocket. Because, as Wint said, 'If you don't have the Constitution, you don't have anything'."
