DOLE INTRODUCES, WITHDRAWS, LEGISLATION TO PREVENT UNIONIZATION OF THE MILITARY

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Senator Bob Dole last night introduced an amendment that would have prohibited the expenditure of funds by the Department of Defense for the "purposes of negotiating or bargaining with any individual, organization, or association with respect to terms or conditions of military service of members of the armed forces."

Senator Dole withdrew his amendment after receiving assurances from Senators John Stennis, Chairman of the Armed Services Committee, and Strom Thurmond, ranking Republican on the Committee, that a permanent bill to prevent unionization of the military would be completed by that Committee within a few days and submitted for consideration by the full Senate.
