## SENATE YOUTH PROGRAM WINNERS ANNOUNCED

WASHINGTON-- Kansas Senators Bob Dole and Nancy Landon Kassebaum today announced the appointment of LeAnn Morgan and Richard Max Davidson as the Kansas delegates to the 20TH ANNIVERSARY United States Senate Youth Program in Washington, D.C. The state's high school student delegates were named by Dr. Merle R. Bolton, Commissioner of Education.

LeAnn Morgan is a resident of Lansing and is Student Council President of Lansing High School. Her extracurricular activities include Debate, Forensics, Dramatics, Thespians, Yearbook, Kayettes, Pep Club, National Honor Society, "L" Club, Volleyball, Softball, and reading. She plans to major in political science and pre-law in college. LeAnn is the daughter of Robert and Joyce Morgan.

Richard Max Davidson resides in Cimarron. He is a student at Cimarron High School, where he serves as Student Council President, and is active in Debate, National Honor Society, Hugh O'Brien Youth Society, Dramatics, Stamp Collecting, Reading, Chess, Running, and Skiing. Richard plans to major in pre-law. His Parents are Max and Nita Davidson.

Chosen as alternates for the 1982 Program were Timothy Paul Longman of El Dorado, and James Robert McKown of Great Bend. Timothy attends El Dorado High School, where he is Student Council President. James is Student Council President at Great Bend High School.

In addition, 102 other selected high school student body officers, two from each state, the District of Columbia, and the Department of Defense Dependents Schools, will make the trip to Washington, D.C. from January 30 - February 6, for a week of intensive study of the federal government and the United States Senate in particular.

While in Washington, the students will follow a fast-paced schedule, to include a day with their respective Senators, briefings throughout the week with Senators, leading Cabinet members, and a Supreme Court Justice. They will also participate in a mock Joint Session of Congress on the floor of the House of Representatives. A visit to the White House is scheduled, with plans to meet the President.

Arrangements in Washington for the 1982 Program are being made by the Senate Advisory Committee under the Co-Chairmanship of Senators Howard Baker (R-TN) and Alan Cranston (D-CA). Randolph A. Hearst is the Foundation Committee Chairman.
