KANSAS JUMPS TO 15th IN NATIONAL RANKINGS ON FEDERAL SPENDING

WASHINGTON -- Senator Robert Dole (R-Kan.) today announced that Kansas has climbed into the 15th slot in the ranking of how much federal money is allocated to each of the 50 states.

Citing statistics released by the Census Department, Dole said Kansas moved up ten notches since Fiscal Year 1981 on the basis of federal spending per capita. According to census figures, the federal government spends \$2,659 per person in Kansas, a sum that is \$68 more than the national average.

The following is the official breakdown of federal spending in Kansas:
