KANSAS SENATORS DOLE AND KASSEBAUM ANNOUNCE

KANSAS STATE HISTORICAL SOCIETY FUNDS

\$280,897 WILL AID PRESERVATION PROJECTS

WASHINGTON -- Kansas Senators Bob Dole and Nancy Kassebaum today announced that the U.S. Department of the Interior has awarded \$280,897 to the Kansas State Historical Society for preservation projects at eight treasured sites.

The National Register properties are as follows:

- Mahaffie House, Olathe
- Salter House, Argonia
- Chase County Courthouse, Cottonwood Falls
- Columbian Building, Topeka
- Munger House, Wichita
- Zimmerman House, Lawrence
- Neal House, Newton
- Koester Block, Marysville

"I am pleased that federal funds will help preserve and protect these unique symbols of our Kansas heritage," said Dole. "Our Kansas history is as rich as its soil, and we have an obligation to future generations, to insure that they too can enjoy and learn from these Kansas landmarks."

"This preservation work is the direct result of President Reagan's emergency jobs bill," said Senator Kassebaum. "It shows what is possible through state and federal cooperation."

The money requires matching funds from the State of Kansas, as set forth in the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966.
