WASHINGTON -- Melissa F. Williams, daughter of Larry and Konnie Williams of Derby, recently completed a four-week internship in Washington, D.C. with Senator Bob Dole.

Melissa, a senior at Texas A&M University, worked as a member of the Senator's personal staff. During her internship, Melissa attended speaker seminars and committee hearings, conducted tours of the Capitol, and researched current legislative issues.
