SENATOR DOLE PICKED FOURTH MOST POWERFUL MAN IN U.S

WASHINGTON, D.C. --- SENATE MAJORITY LEADER BOB DOLE (R-KANS.) HAS BEEN SELECTED THE FOURTH MOST INFLUENTIAL MAN IN AMERICA IN U.S NEWS & WORLD REPORT'S 12TH ANNUAL SURVEY OF "WHO RUNS AMERICA."

Dole was also named the "number one" Senator in the news magazine's prestigious poll.

U.S. News & World Report surveys leaders in 29 fields, and asks them to name five Americans they believe are exercising "the most influence on national life -- whether through position, ability, personality or wealth."

Only President Reagan, Federal Reserve Board Chairman Paul Volcker, and Speaker of the House Thomas P. O'Neill Jr, ranked higher than Dole. Dole jumped from 19th in last year's poll to 4th this year.
