## DOLE SURVEYS ATTITUDES ON FARM ISSUES AT STATE FAIR

(Hutchison, KS) - Visitors to the 1985 Kansas State Fair will have the opportunity to let Sen. Bob Dole (R-KS) know what they think on farm issues. Dole, who has a booth on the fairground's southwestern section in the Industrial Building, will visit the fair this weekend.

Sen. Dole said his visit to the fair and the special survey he is conducting will be useful as the Senate Agriculture Committee resumes deliberations on the 1985 farm bill.

He said, "The farm issue is not as simple as some people think. Many people have different views on how we deal with the problems facing Kansas farmers. The surveys available at the State Fair, and my visit this weekend, will help me determine what consensus there may be on specifics which affect Kansas farmers."

The Dole survey asks for opinions on crop supports for wheat, target pricing, acreage conservation, bonus commodity programs, marketing loan concepts, and farmer-owned reserves.

Sen. Dole said the surveys will be totalled after the fair and the results would help him in mark-up hearings for the new farm bill.
