DOLE, KASSEBAUM AND ROBERTS RECOMMEND KANSANS FOR STATE ASCS COMMITTEE

Washington, D.C. -- Kansas Senators Bob Dole and Nancy Kassebaum and Congressman Pat Roberts announced today that they have recommended three Kansans to serve on the 1990 ASCS State Committee. They are:

Mr. Gregg E. Oswald
Muscotah, Kansas

In making the recommendations to Agriculture Secretary Clayton Yeutter, both senators stated that these individuals will "ably represent the concerns of the farmer."

"It is important to have competent and experienced representation on this committee. These three individuals have an extensive background in farming that will bring sound judgement to the committee," said Dole.

Mr. Hubert owns and operates the Hubert Charolais Ranch near Monument. He is past director of the Kansas Livestock Association and has been recognized for 17 years of work with the ASCS.

Mrs. Woodard and her husband Gail operate a dairy farm and feedlot near Maize. She has served as chairman of the Sedgwick County Farm Bureau Women and is presently a member of the Kansas Farm Bureau State Women's Committee.

Mr. Oswald farms and ranches near Muscotah. He is past president of the Atchison County Farm Bureau and is active in the Farm Bureau's "Young Farmers & Ranchers."

The positions on the ASCS Committee require Presidential appointment.
