#### KANSAN APPOINTED TO WHITE HOUSE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Washington, D.C. -- Carol L. Wohlford, Wichita, Kansas, was recently appointed by the United States Senate Republican Leadership as a member of the Advisory Committee of the White House Conference on Libraries and Information Services.

Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole nominated Wohlford as one of ten Senate appointments.

"This committee is an important link to the soundness of our Nation's library system. Carol Wohlford's extensive educational background and experience in her roles as teacher and librarian throughout the state of Kansas, and on a national level, make her an excellent choice as an advisor to this national conference," said Dole.

The White House Conference, mandated by Congress to meet within the next two years, will be developing recommendations to improve the Nation's library and information services and determining how these can best be utilized by the public. The Advisory Committee will function to assist and advise in planning and conducting the conference.

Wohlford is founder and principal of Paideia Academy, Wichita, Kansas. She holds a Master's degree in Library Science from Emporia State University and pursued additional studies in Library Science at Denver University. She has also been a Slavic Librarian at the Smithsonian Institution, Washington D.C.
