TWO KANSAS RURAL WATER PROJECTS RECEIVE \$884,600: INCREASED SERVICES FOR RURAL CUSTOMERS

WASHINGTON - Kansas Senator Bob Dole announced today \$884,600 in grant and loan funding for two Kansas rural water development projects. The funding was awarded by the Farmers Home Administration, a division of the United States Department of Agriculture.

"Rural water service is the lifeline for many small Kansas communities. I will continue to work with Farmers Home to ensure that these and other essential rural water Kansas projects receive their fair share of federal funding," said Dole.

The two water development projects are:

Rural Water District No. 2 - Nemaha County, will receive a loan of \$160,000 and a conditional commitment for a guaranteed loan of \$20,000 to enable it to improve its water system. This includes a new supply line from Seneca to Baileyville. The system serves 121 rural customers in central Nemaha County.

Rural Water District No. 3, Chautauqua County, will receive a loan of \$150,000 and a two grants totaling \$554,600 to construct a central system. The system will serve 45 rural customers located west of Sedan.



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
