DOLE SELECTS K-STATE PROFESSOR FOR NATIONAL NUTRITION ADVISORY COUNCIL

WASHINGTON - Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole (R-Ks) announced today that he has selected Sue Greig of Manhattan, Kansas, an adjunct professor at Kansas State University and the new president of the American School Food Service Association, to be his appointee to the National Nutrition Monitoring Advisory

"Sue's terrific background in food system management, food assistance, and nutrition education and research make her an ideal candidate for this position," Dole said. "And the Council can really use a Kansan with common sense and hands-on experience in applying nutrition quidance to federal nutrition programs. I know Sue will bring the same dedication and expertise to this job that she has shared with schoolchildren and nutrition professionals in Kansas."

The National Nutrition Monitoring Advisory Council was established under nutrition monitoring legislation enacted last year. The nine-member panel of experts will advise the Secretaries of Agriculture and Health and Human Services on how to improve the federal nutrition monitoring effort. What is learned about Americans' nutritional status through nutrition monitoring can be used to ensure that public programs and policies are as effective as possible in promoting good health through better diets.

Mrs. Greig is a registered dietician with undergraduate degrees in secondary education and food and nutrition from the University of Arkansas and an M.S. in Dietetics, Restaurant and Institutional Management from Kansas State University. She served for many years as the Director of Food Service for the Manhattan school district. She has held leadership positions in the Kansas Dietetic Association and Kansas School Food Service Association and is being installed today as President of the American School Food Service Association. Her professional affiliation with Kansas State University dates back to 1953, when she began working as a teaching dietitian there; she now holds the position of adjunct professor.

Mrs. Greig has also written and lectured extensively on food service management, nutrition, and nutrition education and has testified before Congress on child nutrition issues.
