

REMARKS OF SENATOR BOB DOLE
NEW HAMPSHIRE FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN
WENTWORTH-BY-THE-SEA, NEWCASTLE, NEW HAMPSHIRE
MONDAY, MAY 11, 1970

I AM HONORED AND PRIVILEGED TO BE HERE AT THE INVITATION OF SENATOR COTTON, CONGRESSMEN WYMAN AND CLEVELAND. HAVING SERVED IN THE U. S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES WITH BOTH LOU WYMAN AND JIM CLEVELAND AND NOW IN THE SENATE WITH YOUR MOST DISTINGUISHED SENATOR, I CAN ATTEST THAT THESE MEN PROVIDE YOUR GREAT STATE EXCEPTIONAL REPRESENTATION IN THE HALLS OF CONGRESS. I SAY THIS KNOWING A LITTLE ABOUT THE STATE AND THE FINE PEOPLE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

- TRYING TIMES -

THESE ARE TROUBLED AND TRYING TIMES IN AMERICA, AS EVENTS OF THE RECENT DAYS CLEARLY INDICATE. AT TIMES THE RUSH OF EVENTS AND CRISES SEEM TO OUTSTRIP OUR CAPACITY TO UNDERSTAND THEM OR TO PLACE THEM IN PERSPECTIVE. IN THE CONFUSION EFFORTS ARE SOMETIMES MADE TO BLAME ONE SEGMENT OF SOCIETY OR ANOTHER FOR WHAT WE OFTEN MISUNDERSTAND OR INCOMPLETELY APPRECIATE.

THE BLAME FOR RECENT UNREST HAS BEEN PLACED AMONG VARIOUS GROUPS, INDIVIDUALS AND ORGANIZATIONS.

SOME, MOTIVATED BY PARTISAN POLITICS, PLACE THE BLAME SQUARELY ON PRESIDENT NIXON, VICE PRESIDENT AGNEW, AND MEMBERS OF CONGRESS WHO SUPPORT THIS ADMINISTRATION.

OTHERS GIVE SOME CREDIT FOR UPHEAVAL AND UNREST TO THE MEDIA, PARTICULARLY THE NETWORKS AND THE EASTERN LIBERAL PRESS.

STILL OTHERS -- BUT FRANKLY NOT A VERY VOCAL GROUP -- CREDIT THE RUBINS, THE KUNSTLERS, THE DELLINGERS, THE DAVISES AND OTHERS OF THIS ILK. *The Courts,*

OTHERS BLAME ^APARENTS, STUDENTS, SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, THE POLICE, THE NATIONAL GUARD, AND ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP WHO HAS SOME RESPONSIBILITY IN OUR SOCIETY TODAY.

I SHALL NOT ATTEMPT TODAY TO ASSESS THE BLAME -- THOUGH I HAVE STRONG OPINIONS -- RATHER I WOULD LIKE TO ATTEMPT TO CLARIFY SOME OF THE IMPORTANT AREAS OF CONFUSION AND MISUNDERSTANDING.

- WAR AND POLITICS -

THE WAR IN VIETNAM IS A TRAGIC CONFLICT. IT HAS NOT BEEN IN THE PAST AND SHOULD NEVER BECOME A PARTISAN MATTER, BUT REGRETTABLY MANY LEADING DEMOCRATS ARE INTENT ON MAKING IT SO. FRANKLY, I WAS SHOCKED TO READ YESTERDAY THAT THE NATIONAL DEMOCRAT CHAIRMAN, LAWRENCE J. O'BRIEN, STATED IN A MEETING IN MILWAUKEE, WISCONSIN, SATURDAY EVENING, "I CAN ONLY SPECULATE IN SORROW WHETHER THESE YOUNG PEOPLE (AT KENT) WOULD HAVE BEEN KILLED WERE IT NOT FOR THE NIXON-AGNEW-MITCHELL INFLAMMATORY RHETORIC...". I RECOGNIZE THAT A CHAIRMAN OF A POLITICAL PARTY MUST SPEAK OUT FOR HIS PARTY, BUT IT IS INCREDIBLE THAT A RESPONSIBLE SPOKESMAN FOR ANY PARTY WOULD UTTER SUCH NONSENSE. I BELIEVE MR. O'BRIEN SHOULD PUBLICLY APOLOGIZE TO PRESIDENT NIXON, VICE PRESIDENT AGNEW AND ATTORNEY GENERAL MITCHELL AND TO THE PARENTS OF THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE KILLED AT KENT STATE.

FRANKLY, I AM BECOMING A LITTLE TIRED OF AND FRUSTRATED AT THE PROTESTATIONS OF O'BRIEN AND OTHER LEADING DEMOCRATS IN AND OUT OF CONGRESS, WHO DAILY SEEK TO DIVIDE AND FRUSTRATE NOT ONLY AMERICA'S YOUTH, BUT ALL AMERICANS. BY EMPLOYING SUCH "SPECULATION" USED BY CHAIRMAN O'BRIEN, HE SHOULD, ON BEHALF OF HIS PARTY, ANNOUNCE THAT IF PRESIDENT KENNEDY HAD NOT MOVED COMBAT TROOPS INTO SOUTH VIETNAM IN 1963 AND THAT IF PRESIDENT JOHNSON HAD NOT ESCALATED THE WAR WHICH SENT SOME 540,000 YOUNG AMERICANS TO SOUTH VIETNAM THAT SOME 42,000 AMERICANS MIGHT BE ALIVE TODAY AND THAT NEARLY 300,000 WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN WOUNDED, PRISONERS, OR MISSING IN ACTION.

SO, MR. O'BRIEN -- FIRST LET ME CAUTION YOU TO NOT MAKE TRAGEDY IN AMERICA OR IN VIETNAM A PARTISAN POLITICAL ISSUE -- BUT IF YOU INSIST AND PERSIST, YOU SHALL NOT HAVE IT BOTH WAYS. ADMIT YOUR INDISCRETION, APOLOGIZE TO PRESIDENT NIXON, VICE PRESIDENT AGNEW AND ATTORNEY GENERAL MITCHELL -- OR BE PREPARED TO ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR VIETNAM AND ALL ITS CONSEQUENCES.

WHILE I SHARE THE VIEW THAT WE MUST LOWER OUR VOICES, THIS DOES NOT MEAN STANDING IDLY BY WHILE DEMOCRAT PEDDLERS OF DOOM AND GLOOM TRAMPLE AT WILL ON OUR PRESIDENT OR HIS ADMINISTRATION OR THE RIGHTS, FEELINGS AND HOPES OF A GREAT MAJORITY OF AMERICANS.

LET ME REMIND YOU THAT THIS IS THE SAME MR. O'BRIEN WHO TRAVELLED THE WIDTH AND BREADTH OF THIS COUNTRY IN 1968 AS THE CAMPAIGN CHAIRMAN FOR THE HUMPHREY-MUSKIE TICKET. AT EVERY STOP HE PRAISED THE DEMOCRATS' HANDLING OF THE WAR IN VIETNAM, WHICH HAD PRIMARILY BEEN A SIMULTANEOUS MIXTURE OF ESCALATION AND RETREAT.

LET ME QUICKLY REVIEW THE VIETNAM INHERITANCE PRESIDENT NIXON RECEIVED FROM THE KENNEDY-JOHNSON ADMINISTRATIONS WHEN HE ASSUMED THE PRESIDENCY ON JANUARY 20, 1969:

- 545,000 U.S. TROOPS WERE IN SOUTH VIETNAM; 35,000 HAD LOST THEIR LIVES THERE.
- THE OTHER SIDE WAS PREPARING FOR A NEW OFFENSIVE.
- THERE WAS A WIDE GULF OF DISTRUST BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND SAIGON.
- IN 8 MONTHS IN PARIS THERE HAD BEEN NO PROGRESS IN NEGOTIATIONS.

THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION LAUNCHED AN INTENSIVE REVIEW OF EVERY ASPECT OF THE VIETNAM POLICY, MAKING A SYSTEMATIC, SERIOUS EXAMINATION OF ALL THE ALTERNATIVES OPEN TO THE U.S. AND CAREFULLY CONSIDERING RECOMMENDATIONS OFFERED BY CRITICS AND SUPPORTERS OF PAST U.S. POLICIES.

FOLLOWING THIS IN-DEPTH REVIEW, THE PRESIDENT DECIDED UPON A POLICY THAT:

- HONORS OUR COMMITMENT TO SOUTH VIETNAMESE SELF-DETERMINATION.
- PROVIDES FOR THE ORDERLY REPLACEMENT OF U.S. COMBAT TROOPS BY THE SOUTH VIETNAMESE.
- PROVIDES A PALTFORM UPON WHICH AN HONORABLE SETTLEMENT COULD BE NEGOTIATED.

- WHAT HAVE BEEN THE RESULTS OF PRESIDENT NIXON'S POLICY? -

IN THE FIRST INSTANCE, PRESIDENT NIXON HAS CONSTANTLY INFORMED THE AMERICAN PEOPLE OF OUR INVOLVEMENT IN VIETNAM AND OF HIS EFFORTS TO EXTRICATE US. SECONDLY, IN JANUARY, MARCH AND MAY OF 1969, PRESIDENT NIXON LISTED PROPOSALS FOR NEGOTIATIONS IN PARIS AND THE ESSENTIAL PRINCIPLES FOR SETTLEMENT.

ON MAY 14, IN AN HISTORIC ADDRESS TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE, HE MADE IT ABUNDANTLY CLEAR THAT WE SEEK NO BASES OR MILITARY TIES, NOR WOULD WE SEEK TO IMPOSE ANY PARTICULAR FORM OF GOVERNMENT ON THE SOUTH VIETNAMESE. HE ALSO ANNOUNCED AT THAT TIME, AFTER FULL CONSULTATIONS WITH PRESIDENT THIEU, CONCRETE MEASURES TOWARD ACHIEVING A JUST AND LASTING PEACE.

- FIRST TROOP WITHDRAWALS -

ON JUNE 8, 1969, A REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT ANNOUNCED THE FIRST TROOP WITHDRAWALS IN THE VIETNAM WAR, WHEN RICHARD NIXON ANNOUNCED THAT 25,000 U.S. COMBAT TROOPS WOULD BE WITHDRAWN. SOME THIRTY DAYS LATER, SOUTH VIETNAMESE PRESIDENT THIEU ANNOUNCED AN ELECTION PROPOSAL WHICH PROVIDES THAT ALL POLITICAL FORCES, INCLUDING THE NATIONAL LIBERATION FRONT, COULD PARTICIPATE. NOTWITHSTANDING PRESIDENT NIXON'S

EFFORTS AND THE EFFORTS OF PRESIDENT THIEU, THE INTRANSIGENCE ON THE OTHER SIDE CONTINUED AND IN FACT AT THIS VERY TIME, TENS OF THOUSANDS OF HANOI'S TROOPS ARE PREPARING TO WAGE OR ARE WAGING WAR AGAINST LAOS, CAMBODIA AND THAILAND.

IT WAS AN UNDAUNTED REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT WHO ON SEPTEMBER 17 ANNOUNCED A SECOND REDUCTION OF 35,000 U.S. TROOPS. ON NOVEMBER 3, THE PRESIDENT AGAIN REPORTED TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE HIS EFFORTS FOR PEACE BY NEGOTIATION, AND OF HIS EFFORTS FOR PEACE THROUGH VIETNAMIZATION. YOU MAY RECALL AT THAT TIME THE PRESIDENT ASKED THE AMERICAN PEOPLE FOR SUPPORT, AND SUPPORT POURED IN FROM AMERICANS EVERYWHERE. AGAIN ON DECEMBER 15, A REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT ANNOUNCED A THIRD TROOP WITHDRAWAL OF 50,000, TO BE COMPLETED BY APRIL 15, 1970. THIS GOAL WAS REACHED, AND BY APRIL 15, THERE WAS A TOTAL TROOP REDUCTION OF 115,500 LOWER THAN THE TROOP CEILING AUTHORIZED WHEN NIXON WAS SWORN IN.

DURING ALL THIS TIME, DEMOCRATS CONTINUED THEIR ATTACKS ON PRESIDENT NIXON BECAUSE HE HAD NOT ENDED IN ONE YEAR A WAR WHICH IT HAD TAKEN TWO DEMOCRAT ADMINISTRATIONS FIVE YEARS TO CREATE. NOTWITHSTANDING THE UNWARRANTED ATTACKS BY DEMOCRATS AND THE LIBERAL MEDIA, PRESIDENT NIXON HAS PURSUED HIS POLICY OF VIETNAMIZATION AND, AS YOU KNOW, ON APRIL 20 IN A RADIO-T.V. REPORT TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE, ANNOUNCED PLANS TO WITHDRAW ANOTHER 150,000 AMERICANS BY NEXT SPRING. AGAIN HE STRESSED THE HOPE THAT MORE PROGRESS COULD BE MADE AT A FASTER PACE IF THE ENEMY WOULD ONLY NEGOTIATE IN PARIS.

- CAMBODIA -

ON APRIL 30, THE PRESIDENT REAFFIRMED HIS INTENTION TO DIS-
ENGAGE FROM SOUTH VIETNAM AND TO WIN A JUST PEACE. IN ADDITION, HE
ANNOUNCED A NUMBER OF NORTH VIETNAMESE ESCALATIONS AND POINTED OUT
THAT THE U.S. HAD THREE OPTIONS:

- (1) TO DO NOTHING;
- (2) TO PROVIDE MASSIVE MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO CAMBODIA ITSELF; OR
- (3) TO GO TO THE HEART OF THE TROUBLE AND CLEAN OUT MAJOR
COMMUNIST SANCTUARIES ALONG THE CAMBODIA-VIETNAM BORDER.

THE PRESIDENT AS COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF IN HIS ANNOUNCED EFFORT TO
PROTECT AMERICAN LIVES AND TO KEEP THE VIETNAMIZATION PROGRAM ON
SCHEDULE MADE THE DIFFICULT CHOICE -- NUMBER THREE.

THIS ANNOUNCEMENT BROUGHT A PREDICTABLE RESPONSE FROM MANY
IN CONGRESS, MANY IN THE PRESS, AND MANY IN RADIO AND TELEVISION.
THE DEMOCRAT SENATOR FROM MASSACHUSETTS REFERRED TO IT AS "MADNESS"

AND THAT IT INDICATED A LACK OF JUDGMENT -- SOMETHING HE HAD NOT INDICATED IN 1963 WHEN HIS BROTHER ORDERED SOME 18,000 AMERICANS TO SOUTH VIETNAM.

THE SAME LAWRENCE O'BRIEN REFERRED TO A FEW MOMENTS AGO CALLED THE CAMBODIAN ACTION "A TRAGIC DECISION BASED ON A SERIES OF MISJUDGMENTS". O'BRIEN AT THE SAME TIME COMPLAINED THE VIETNAMIZATION POLICY HAD FAILED.

UNDOUBTEDLY THERE ARE SOME HERE TODAY WHO HAVE RESERVATIONS CONCERNING THE CAMBODIAN OPERATION -- AND I HAVE SOME MYSELF. HOWEVER, I AM WILLING TO GIVE A REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT -- OR ANY PRESIDENT FOR THAT MATTER -- AN OPPORTUNITY TO PROVE HIMSELF, PARTICULARLY IN THIS INSTANCE WHERE PRESIDENT NIXON HAS BEEN MAKING PROGRESS IN GETTING US OUT OF VIETNAM. LET ME ASSURE YOU THAT PRESIDENT NIXON MADE THE CAMBODIAN DECISION SOLELY IN AN EFFORT TO SHORTEN THE WAR, NOT TO PROLONG IT OR TO EXPAND IT.

THAT YOU OR I MAY NOT AGREE FULLY WITH THE DETAILS OF THE CAMBODIAN OPERATION IS OF SECONDARY IMPORTANCE. WE HAVE THE LUXURY OF UNACCOUNTABLE CRITICISM. WE CAN BE MONDAY MORNING QUARTERBACKS OR BACK-SEAT DRIVERS AT WILL. WE CAN SECOND-GUESS AND WE CAN SINCERELY DISAGREE, BUT IN THE FINAL ANALYSIS THE AWESOME FINAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR PROTECTING AMERICAN LIVES FALLS ON THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF.

AS PRESIDENT NIXON SAID IN HIS PRESS CONFERENCE LAST FRIDAY, EVENING, "DON'T JUDGE US TOO QUICKLY". HE IS WILLING TO BE JUDGED WHEN THE EVIDENCE IS IN, WHEN THE FACTS ARE KNOWN. HE WILL ACCEPT THE JUDGMENT OF SINCERE AMERICANS OF DIFFERING PHILOSOPHIES AND DIFFERING PARTIES BECAUSE HE, BETTER THAN ANY OF US, REALIZES THE DIMENSIONS OF THE CONFLICT AND THE DECISIONS HE MUST MAKE. HE KNOWS, HOWEVER, THAT HE WILL BE JUDGED BY SOME WHO HAVE LITTLE, IF ANY, KNOWLEDGE OF THE FACTS, BY RADICALS AND POLITICAL OPPORTUNISTS. AS A PUBLIC FIGURE HE RECOGNIZES SOME PUT HIS POLITICAL DESTRUCTION AHEAD OF THE BEST INTERESTS OF OUR COUNTRY AND OUR YOUNG MEN IN UNIFORM.

- CAMPUS UNREST -

IN RECENT DAYS WE HAVE WITNESSED STUDENT REVOLTS ALL ACROSS THE COUNTRY. IT CAN BE ASSUMED THAT A LARGE MEASURE OF THE CAMPUS UNREST STEMS DIRECTLY FROM THE WAR IN VIETNAM, PERHAPS MORE SPECIFICALLY THE CAMBODIAN OPERATION AND THE TRAGEDY AT KENT STATE. THEREFORE, LET ME TURN BRIEFLY TO THE SUBJECT OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE, THEIR ATTITUDE AND ROLE IN PRESENT AND FUTURE DEBATES OF NATIONAL ISSUES.

IN THE LAST WEEK THE YOUNG PEOPLE OF OUR COUNTRY HAVE OCCUPIED A PROMINENT PLACE IN THE NEWS -- FROM THE TRAGIC DEATHS AT KENT STATE, TO THE EVENTS AT NUMEROUS COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, TO THE DEMONSTRATIONS IN WASHINGTON OVER THE WEEKEND.

THEY HAVE FOR THE MOST PART OPPOSED CURRENT U.S. POLICY IN SOUTHEAST ASIA.

I RESPECT RESPONSIBLE DIFFERENCE AND MEASURED CRITICISM FROM WHATEVER SOURCE. THOSE WHO FEEL THEY MUST SPEAK OUT SHOULD DO SO.

I WAS IMPRESSED BY MOST OF THE EVENTS IN WASHINGTON LAST WEEK. CONCERNED YOUNG PEOPLE AND OTHERS WHO HOLD STRONG AND SINCERE BELIEFS IN THE UNWISDOM OF CURRENT U.S. POLICY MADE A DISCIPLINED, IF SOMEWHAT DISORGANIZED, PRESENTATION OF THEIR VIEWS TO THEIR NATIONAL LEADERS.

FOR THREE DAYS SCORES OF STUDENTS FROM KANSAS AND ELSEWHERE CAME TO MY OFFICE AND STATED THEIR BELIEFS. WE OFTEN DISAGREED. SOMETIMES WE DEFINED COMMON GROUNDS AND GOALS. BUT THE IMPORTANT THING IS THAT WE MET AND EXCHANGED IDEAS AND GAINED UNDERSTANDING.

A TRIBUTE TO THE EARNESTNESS OF MOST OF THEM WAS THEIR DEDICATION AND RESOLVE TO AVOID VIOLENCE AND DISTURBANCE OVER THE WEEKEND.

BUT NOW THAT THE STUDENTS HAVE LEARNED TO MOBILIZE THEIR NUMBERS FOR DEMONSTRATIONS, AND TO GAIN THE EARS OF THEIR PRESIDENT AND LEGISLATORS, THEY MUST DEMONSTRATE RESPONSIBILITY.

THE BALL IS IN THEIR COURT NOW, AND THEY MUST TAKE IT AND PROVE TO THEMSELVES AND THEIR ELDERS THAT THEY CAN CARRY IT WISELY AND WELL.

THEY MUST USE THEIR POWER TO OPEN AND BROADEN EDUCATION, NOT CLOSE AND CONSTRICT IT.

LET THEM GO BACK TO THEIR CAMPUSES IN THE FALL DETERMINED THAT THEIR INSTITUTIONS WILL STAY OPEN AND THAT THEIR PARTICIPATION IN THE ACADEMIC LIFE WILL CONTRIBUTE TO IT RATHER THAN DETRACT FROM IT.

LET THEIR GOAL BE PARTICIPATION AND CONTRIBUTION RATHER THAN TURMOIL AND DISRUPTION.

WE MUST REMEMBER THAT NOT ALL STUDENTS SHARE THE BELIEFS OF THOSE WHO CAME TO WASHINGTON THIS WEEK, AND THEY MUST HAVE THEIR VIEWS HEARD TOO. THEY MUST HAVE THE SAME OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPRESS THEIR POSITIONS AND TO PURSUE THEIR GOALS IN EDUCATION, POLITICS AND LIFE AS THOSE WHO DISSENT.

THESE INSTITUTIONS MUST BE OPEN TO WORK AND TO ALLOW FOR CONTENTION BETWEEN OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS IN THE GREAT AMERICAN TRADITION OF DEBATE, DISCUSSION AND INTERACTION.

TODAY'S YOUTH HAS GREAT POTENTIAL. LET US HOPE THAT THEY WILL LIVE UP TO THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES. I BELIEVE THEY CAN.

BUT AGAIN LET ME ADD A WORD OF CAUTION -- IF THOSE WHO SEEK THE DESTRUCTION OF THIS SOCIETY RATHER THAN ITS REFORM SEIZE THE YOUTH MOVEMENT FOR THEIR OWN NARROW-DESTRUCTIVE ENDS, ALL OF US COULD BE IN VERY DEEP TROUBLE INDEED.

- CONCLUSION -

1970 IS A YEAR OF CHALLENGE TO ALL REPUBLICANS. WE ARE WITNESSING IN MANY INSTANCES A FOOT-DRAGGING CONTEST BY THE DEMOCRATS WHO CONTROL BOTH THE HOUSE AND THE SENATE. IT GOES WITHOUT SAYING THAT WE MUST RETURN LOU WYMAN AND JIM CLEVELAND TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, BUT BEYOND THE CONFINES OF NEW HAMPSHIRE AND MY STATE OF KANSAS WHICH HAS AN ALL REPUBLICAN CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION, EFFORTS MUST BE MADE TO GIVE PRESIDENT NIXON A WORKING MAJORITY IN THE SENATE AND HOPEFULLY IN THE HOUSE IN 1971 AND 1972. THIS CAN BE ACCOMPLISHED WITH A NET GAIN OF SEVEN SEATS IN THE SENATE, AND JUST THE PAST TWO WEEKS ARE CHANCES FOR GAINING SEATS IN TEXAS AND OHIO HAVE REMARKABLY IMPROVED. THERE IS EVERY REASON TO BELIEVE THAT NOTWITHSTANDING THE PRESENT TURMOIL AND THE PRESENT DISCORD THAT PRESIDENT NIXON HAS A RESERVE OF STRENGTH IN EVERY STATE IN AMERICA.

I BELIEVE THAT THE VOTERS OF AMERICA WILL DETERMINE IN NOVEMBER THAT THE ONLY SURE WAY TO SECURE REFORM OF THE DRAFT AND OF THE POSTAL SYSTEM AND THE ONLY WAY TO SECURE PASSAGE OF SIGNIFICANT MEASURES DEALING WITH CRIME AND TO REDUCE NON-ESSENTIAL SPENDING IS TO GIVE PRESIDENT NIXON A REPUBLICAN MAJORITY.
