IT IS A PLEASURE TO BE HERE AT THIS OK GRAIN CO-OP DINNER AND TO HAVE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE WITH YOU SOME OF MY VIEWS ABOUT WHAT'S IN STORE FOR FARMERS AND FOR RURAL AMERICA.

BASIC OPTIMISM

WITH ALL THE PROBLEMS FACING FARMERS THESE DAYS -- AND BELIEVE

ME, I DON'T MINIMIZE THEM -- I MAINTAIN A CERTAIN OPTIMISM ABOUT WHAT'S

AHEAD. LAST YEAR WAS A GOOD YEAR FOR AGRICULTURE. THIS YEAR, DESPITE

HIGHER PRICES, THREATS OF TRUCK STRIKES AND THE REST, CAN BE A GOOD

YEAR AS WELL.

BUT WHETHER THE TRUCKS ROLL WITHOUT INTERRUPTION, OR NOT; NO
MATTER IF THE PRICES FOR FUEL AND FERTILIZER AND OTHER SUPPLIES WERE CUT

IN HALF TOMORROW -- THERE WOULD BE STILL ONE PROBLEM TO BE OVERCOME.

IT IS ONE WE SOMETIMES IGNORE, BECAUSE IT SEEMS LESS IMMEDIATE
THAN THE OTHERS. IT IS A PROBLEM OF ATTITUDE -- BUT IT IS A SERIOUS
PROBLEM NONETHELESS.

EXPORTS BLAMED FOR PROBLEM

JUST A FEW WEEKS AGO, MR GEORGE MEANY PROVIDED ME WITH A PERFECT EXAMPLE OF THIS PROBLEM. MEANY WAS TESTIFYING BEFORE THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF WHICH I AM A MEMBER, DURING SOME HEARINGS WE WERE HOLDING ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE.

NOW, I WOULD BE QUICK TO POINT OUT THAT I AGREED WITH MR. MEANY ON SOME OF THE POINTS HE MADE. HE IS CAUTIOUS ABOUT DETENTE -- AND I AGREE WE CAN'T RUSH INTO IT WITH OUR EYES CLOSED.

HE WANTS TO MAINTAIN A STRONG DEFENSE FOR AMERICA -- AND I THINK HE IS ABSOLUTELY RIGHT ON THAT.

BUT I PART COMPANY WITH HIM WHEN HE STARTS TALKING ABOUT INTER-NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL TRADE -- WHEN HE SAYS THINGS LIKE

"MUCH OF THE GAIN IN THE TRADE ACCOUNTS
WAS THE RESULT OF HEAVY EXPORTS OF FARM
GOODS AND CRITICAL RAW MATERIALS."

HE MAY BE RIGHT, THERE, BUT LISTEN TO THE CONCLUSION HE DRAWS.

"AND IT WAS EXPORTS OF THESE COMMODITIES" (SAYS

MR. MEANY) "WHICH CAUSED SHARP DOMESTIC SHORTAGES

AND BROUGHT ON THE RAPID ACCELERATION OF INFLATION."

THERE IT IS IN A NUTSHELL. BASICALLY, THE SHORTAGES WE HAVE SUFFERED, THE HIGH INFLATION RATES, CAN BE BLAMED ON THE FARMER WHO HAS BEEN EXPORTING HIS PRODUCTS OVERSEAS, WHERE THE DEMAND IS HIGH. THE USUAL COROLLARY TO SUCH A SIMPLISTIC CHARGE IS THAT THE FARMERS WHO ARE DOING ALL THIS EXPORTING ARE GETTING RICH IN THE PROCESS, AND

AT THE EXPENSE OF ALL THE REST OF US.

WIDESPREAD MISUNDERSTANDING

AND THERE ARE SIMPLY TOO MANY PEOPLE LEFT IN THIS COUNTRY WHO
STILL THINK THAT RISING FOOD PRICES MEAN FARMERS ARE GETTING RICH. YET
EVEN THOUGH WE ARE NOW PREPARING TO BRING IN WHAT WE HOPE WILL BE ONE
OF THE BIGGEST WHEAT CROPS EVER, WE HAVE JUST SEEN THE WHEAT MARKET
DROP AGAIN.

WHAT WILL FARM CRITICS SAY ABOUT THAT. WHAT WILL MR. MEANY SAY?

IF THE PRICE OF BREAD RISES, WILL THEY STILL INSIST ITS BECAUSE WE SOLD

WHEAT TO RUSSIA, AND MADE FARMERS RICH.

MAYBE. BUT I'D DEFY MR. MEANY -- OR ANYONE TO EXPLAIN HOW HIGHER WHEAT PRICES COULD HAVE CAUSED THE PRICE OF A TRACTOR TO CLIMB FROM \$8,000 TO \$15,000 OR HIGHER. THEY DON'T USE A LOT OF WHEAT TO MAKE A TRACTOR, BUT THEY SURE USE A LOT OF LABOR.

FOOD PRICES INFLATION SYMPTOM, NOT CAUSE

IF THE HOUSEWIFE EVER DOES PAY A DOLLAR FOR A LOAF OF BREAD, IT WON'T BE BECAUSE THE FARMER IS GETTING RICH. IT WILL BE BECAUSE THE BAKER, WHO WORKS HARD, THE PEOPLE WHO WORK HARD FOR THE BAKER, WHO PACKAGE HIS BREAD, DRIVE HIS TRUCKS, WORK IN THE STORES, NEED AND ARE GETTING HIGHER WAGES.

I AM NOT SAYING THEY AREN'T ENTITLED TO THESE WAGES. FAR FROM

IT. THEY ARE PAYING MORE FOR WHAT THEY BUY, JUST AS THE FARMERS ARE.

I AM ONLY ASKING THAT PEOPLE REALIZE THAT RISING FOOD PRICES ARE NOT

THE CAUSE OF INFLATION. THEY ARE JUST ONE OF ITS MOST VISIBLE SYMPTOMS.

BUT WHILE WAGES HAVE BEEN RISING, THE FARMER, UP UNTIL A YEAR OR TWO AGO, HAS BEEN RECEIVING THE SAME PRICE FOR HIS BUSHEL OF WHEAT AS HE RECEIVED TWENTY YEARS AGO.

THAT HAS BEGUN TO CHANGE -- AND I SAY ITS ABOUT TIME.

IN THE PAST MONTH, HOWEVER, WE HAVE SEEN THE PRIC E DROP AS

MUCH AS 98¢ PER B USHEL. I UNDERSTAND THAT HERE IN KIOWA, IT DROPPED FROM \$5.10 ON MARCH 1ST TO \$3.14 LAST THURSDAY.

THAT IS A \$1.96 DROP IN PRICE -- AND THAT IS MORE THAN YOU WERE SELLING WHEAT FOR 3 OR 4 YEARS AGO.

ARAB OIL -- AMERICAN FOOD

BUT NOW IS NOT THE TIME TO PANIC. NOW IS THE TIME TO SETTLE-DOWN AND MAKE PLANS FOR THE FUTURE, SHORT AND LONG RANGED.

NOW IS THE TIME TO LOOK AHEAD TO OVERCOMING THE PROBLEMS WE FACE.

NOW IS THE TIME TO LOOK AHEAD TO POTENTIAL MARKETS AND TO POSSIBLE

CHANGES IN SOME TRADE BARRIERS THAT HAVE PREVENTED TRADING IN THE PAST.

FOR THE FACT REMAINS THAT THE LONG RANGE PICTURE FOR WHEAT EXPORTS

HAS NEVER BEEN BETTER. AS LONG AS THE WORLD'S POPULATION KEEPS GROWING AT

THE RATE OF 70 MILLION PER YEAR, THE UNITED STATES WILL BE IN THE DRIVERS SEAT AS A SOURCE FOR BASIC FOOD SUPPLIES.

OUR CAPACITY TO PRODUCE FOOD IS AS IMPORTANT TO THE WORLD AS THE ARAB OIL PRODUCING CAPACITY. IN THE LONG RANGE, I FORSEE OUR FOOD DOMINANCE BEING EVEN STRONGER THAN THE ARAB'S OIL DOMINANCE. THE POTENTIAL LONG RANGE MARKETS ARE CERTAINLY THERE AND I AM WORKING TO SEE THAT AMERICAN FARMERS GET THEIR SHARE OF THOSE MARKETS.

REGARDING THE SHORT RANGE PROSPECTS WE HAVE ALREADY SEEN IN THE PAST TWO YEARS WHAT CAN HAPPEN IN EXPORTS. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS HAVE DOUBLED FROM \$10 TO 20 BILLION. AND WE HAVE SEEN WHAT THOSE EXPORTS CAN DO TO THE PRICES FARMERS RECEIVE.

HIGH WORLD DEMAND CONTINUES

NOW IS THE TIME TO REALLY MAKE SURE THAT THE EXPORTS WILL KEEP FLOWING, WHEN THE NEW WHEAT STARTS MOVING THROUGH HOUSTON, GALVESTON, NEW ORLEANS AND OTHER PORTS. IT WON'T BE LONG UNTIL THE EXPORTERS START ANNOUNCING NEW SALES. REMEMBER ALL WE HAVE HEARD FROM THE EXPORTERS RECENTLY HAS BEEN ABOUT THEIR CURTAILMENTS OF SHIPMENTS UNTIL AFTER HARVEST. THE EXPORTER DIDN'T GO OUT OF BUSINESS THOUGH AND I AM CONFIDENT THERE WILL BE NEW SALES ANNOUNCED SOON.

I CAN'T PROMISE \$4 OR \$5 WHEAT FOR THIS COMING YEAR. BUT I DO

FEEL THAT IMPROVED PRICES ARE LIKELY WITH THE DEMANDITHAT EXISTS IN THE

WORLD FOR WHEAT AND FOR ALL KINDS OF PROTEIN AND WITH THE ABILITY WE

HAVE TO PROVIDE THIS WONDERFUL RENEWABLE PROTEIN SOURCE, THE DEMAND IS

THERE AS IS THE SUPPLY. IF WE CAN MAINTAIN PEACE WITH OUR TRADING PARTNERS,

AND IMPROVE OUR TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM. I AM CONFIDENT WE WILL SEE \$5
WHEAT AGAIN. MAYBE THIS YEAR, MAYBE NOT, BUT AS LONG AS THIS WORLD'S
POPULATION CONTINUES TO GROW, THE WHEAT PRODUCERS OF THIS NATION -- AND
KANSAS W- WILL GET THEIR SHARE.

STABILIZING COSTS EXPECTED

I DON'T MINIMIZE THE INCREASES IN COSTS THAT YOU HAVE FACED THE PAST TWO YEARS. IF YOU CAN GET EQUIPMENT OR SUPPLIES, IT MOST LIKELY COSTS YOU TWO OR EVEN THREE TIMES AS MUCH AS IT DID TWO YEARS AGO. I FEEL THAT THIS INTOLERABLE PRICE SITUATION IS BEGINNING TO STABILIZE, HOWEVER, AND DO NOT FORESEE FUTURE PRICE RISES OF ANYWHERE NEAR THE SAME MAGNITUDE OF THOSE WE HAVE SEEN THIS PAST YEAR. MANUFACTURERS WILL EXPAND PRODUCTION TO BRING ABOUT MORE REALISTIC PRICES BUT THIS WILL INEVITABLY TAKE SOME TIME.

IN THE MEANTIME, WE NEED TO LET THOSE OVERSEAS MARKETS KNOW

WE ARE NOT ABOUT TO IMPOSE ANY EXPORT EMBARGOES. WE NEED TO ASSURE THEM

THAT WE PLAN TO CONTINUE PRODUCING, AND SUPPLYING THEM WITH GOOD HIGH

QUALITY WHEAT. THEY HAVE EVERY RIGHT TO BE CONCERNED ABOUT THE

AVAILABILITY OF WHEAT FOR EXPORT. THE PRESSURES FOR CONTROLS HAVE BEEN

TREMENDOUS, IN THE FACE OF PREDICTIONS THAT WE WERE ABOUT TO RUN OUT OF

WHEAT AND THAT OUR HOUSEWIVES WOULD BE PAYING \$1 A LOAF FOR BREAD. BUT

WHY SHOULD OUR OVERSEAS TRADING PARTNERS RUSH IN NOW, WHEN THEY SEE THE

MARKET DROPPING.

THE EXPORTERS AREN'T ABOUT TO START BUYING AGAIN UNTIL HARVEST

STARTS AND THEY MAKE SOME SALES. THEY HAVE JUST DELAYED THE DELIVERY OF

35 TO 45 MILLION BUSHELS OF WHEAT TO ACCOMODATE THE DOMESTIC MARKETS.

BUT JUST AS SOON AS HARVEST STARTS, THOSE DEFERRED SHIPMENTS WILL START

MOVING OUT OF THE PORTS AND THOSE EXPORTERS WILL START MAKING NEW SALES.

EXPANSION OF PL 480 SOUGHT

NOW IS THE TIME FOR US TO LOOK TO THE HUNGRY NATIONS AND SEE THAT
THEY ARE WELL SUPPLIED. NOW IS THE TIME TO EXPAND THE FOOD FOR PEACE PROGRAM
(PL 480). I HAVE REPEATEDLY URGED THIS EFFORT IN THE PAST FEW WEEKS AND
GRADUALLY WE ARE SEEING SOME MOVEMENT OF GRAIN TO HUNGRY PEOPLE THROUGH
THIS PROGRAM. REMEBER THAT SOME OF THE NATIONS WHO ARE MOST IN NEED
OF THESE PROGRAMS ARE GOING THROUGH INTERNAL REVOLUTION AT THE PRESENT
AND THIS PREVENTS NEGOTIATION IN THE PL 480 PROGRAM.

TRANSPORTATION PROBLEMS REAL

WE ALL REMEBER WHEN THE BOXCARS AND TRUCKS WERE BUMPER TO BUMPER
FROM KIOWA TO THE PORTS ON THE GULF. THAT IS A BIG PROBLEM WE HAVE TO
FACE AGAIN THIS YEAR AND I HAVE DISCUSSED THIS REPEATEDLY WITH SECRETARY

OF AGRICULTURE BUTZ AND GEORGE STAFFORD, CHAIRMAN OF THE ICC. THEY
ASSURE ME THEY ARE READY TO ASSIST IN ANY WAY TO MAKE SURE THE GRAIN
KEEPS MOVING THIS YEAR.

IT WON'T BE PERFECT. WE'LL HAVE SOME PROBLEMS BUT JUST LAST WEEK
WE FINALLY GOT THE 100% AGRICULTURE PRIORITY FOR FUEL STRAIGHTENED OUT
SO THAT FARMERS WILL GET THE 100 % OF FUEL NEEDS BEFORE THE ALLOCATION
FOR GENERAL USE TAKES PLACE.

KANSANS TESTIFY ON FUEL

IT HAD SOME REAL HELP IN THAT EFFORT FROM THE CO-OPS IN KANSAS, AS
FOUR MANAGERS OF LOCAL CO-OPS CAME TO WASHINGTON TO TESTIFY AT HEARINGS OF
A SENATE AGRICULTURE COMMITTEE SUBCOMMITTEE AT MY REQUEST. AS A RESULT,
THE REGULATIONS WERE CHANGED TO REFLECT A TRUE PRIORITY FOR AGRICULTURE.

YOU SHOULD HAVE ADEQUATE DIESEL AND PROPANE THROUGH HARVEST. GASOLINE
MAY STILL BE A LITTLE SHORT, AS THEY HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO ADLOT ENOUGH
TO GET RESERVE SUPPLIES IN THE AREA TO SUFFICIENT LEVELS TO ACCOMODATE
THE DISAPPEARANCE THAT TAKES PLACE WHEN YOU START CUTTING WHEAT. BUT
THE PRIORITY IS THERE. AND I AM WORKING ON SPECIAL CONTINGENCY PLANS
TO GET SOME RELIEF TO ANY CRITICAL AREAS DURING HARVEST AND THE STATE
ASC OFFICE HAS PLEDGED THEIR COOPERATION IN LOCATING THOSE CRITICAL AREAS.
HOPEFULLY, WE SHOULD HAVE THE NECESSARY FUEL TO GET THE WHEAT CUT.

AS FAR AS THE TRANSPORTATION TO THE PORTS IS CONCERNED, I AM ASKING
THE SENATE AGRICULTURE COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE AND MONITOR THE SITUATION
THIS YEAR. IT IS ENTIRELY POSSIBLE THAT WE WILL BE HOLDING FIELD HEARINGS
AROUND HARVEST TIME TO CHECK ON THE EXPORT MOVEMENT OF WHEAT FROM KANSAS
TO THE GULF PORTS SO THAT WE MIGHT DEVELOP POSSIBLE LEGISLATIVE REMEDIES

TO IMPROVE THE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM.

ALL OVER THE STATE, AND INDEED ALL OVER THE COUNTRY, PEOPLE ARE MAKING PREPARATION FOR HARVEST. IN THE FIELDS, OF COURSE, BUT ALSO IN THE OFFICE OF THE FEDERAL ENERGY OFFICE, THE ICC, THE CORPORATE OFFICES OF THE RAILROADS, THE TRUCKING CONCERNS, PEOPLE ARE FOCUSING ON HARVEST AND WORKING TO ANTICIPATE AND MEET THE NEEDS THAT ARE SURE TO ARISE.

THE BASIC JOB IS YOURS -- AND THE ATTENTIONS OF MUCH OF THE COUNTRY ARE FOCUSED ON THE EFFORT YOU'LL BE MAKING. BUT YOU WILL NEED SOME HELP AND ALL OF THESE PEOPLE -- AS WELL AS MYSELF -- ARE READY AND EAGER TO OFFER THAT HELP WHEN NEEDED.
