### CLOSE UP RECEPTION - MAY 13, 1980

### Background

For nine years of CLOSE UP, we have been trying to find ways to broaden the opportunity for students and teachers around the country to share in the experiences that the Washington participants gain through CLOSE UP. This has been accomplished through pre and post program activities, teacher programs and various other activities.

Last summer, however, an idea was developed which gave the Close Up Foundation an opportunity to reach many, many more students and teachers with its seminars -- through the use of modern technology. The Cable-Satellite Public Affairs Network -- or as it's called, C-SPAN -- which televises gavel to gavel coverage of the House offered to share the down time on its satellite when the House was not in session.

Through a cooperative arrangement between C-SPAN and CLOSE UP and through the generous support of Conoco Inc., 68 CLOSE UP seminars on various issues of government have been aired to more than 1,200 high schools across the country and to more than 6,000,000 homes.

The purpose of the evening is to celebrate the success of this effort and to recognize Conoco Inc. for its outstanding contribution to making these learning opportunities available to students and teachers across America.
