Talking Points for Colorado Forum Breakfast

I understand you have agreed to address the Colorado Forum Breakfast. The Colorado Forum is a business coalition based in Denver and is a member of the National Water Alliance (NWA). They are interested in any comments you may have related to business and water issues.

Below are some suggested talking points regarding water issues. Nancy Olson Pascale helped me draft them and will be at the meeting to answer any questions.

National Water Alliance

- o The National Water Alliance was established to address key water problems and develop a consensus on solutions. Membership is composed of business and industry, state and local governments, environmental groups, and concerned individual citizens.
- o Current issues: groundwater, water quality, financial issues including tax policy, cost-sharing.
- O NWA is sponsoring a high school debate championship in Washington, D.C. June 10-12. This year's high school debate topic concerns water policy in the U.S.

Current Water Legislation

- o Safe Drinking Water Act Conference Committee reached a compromise that appears signable by the President. Includes some groundwater provisions. Floor action expected soon.
 - O Clean Water Act Conference Committee currently underway. Administration claims both the House and Senate version are too costly. They would prefer a revolving loan fund instead of construction grants.
 - o Superfund Conference currently underway split among conferees on financing mechanism.
 - o Omnibus Water Legislation Passed Senate March 26 awaiting appointment of House conferees.
 - o Tax Legislation Group would be interested in latest developments on taxing of municipal bonds.
