Bankers will be pleased to listen to any topic you care to bring up, but obviously the hot item for them these days is the tax reform bill. You should know that the New Hampshire Bankers Association has already taken a position in support of the Finance Committee tax reform bill, even with the restriction on IRA deductions (partly, no doubt, because Finance didn't tamper with the banks' loan loss reserve, as the House bill does). They have no major concerns over possible banking legislation (partly because they don't think any major bills will get

through this year). The NHBA does oppose several pending House bills that would impose limits on credit card interest charges (overriding State usury laws).

You might want to make the point that Congress wouldn't be entertaining ideas like Federal usury limits if bank consumer lending rates were coming down more in line with interest rates in general. Rates are down about 30% this year, but rates on bank consumer loans, at least on credit cards, have hardly come down at all. That's a good way for banks to compete, if they really want to compete.

And if they don't want to compete, Congress may become more sympathetic to alternative providers of financial services: nonbank banks, thrifts, and in-house operations like Sears Financial Network.
