

### REMARKS OF SENATOR BOB DOLE J.M. FOUNDATION "SEARCH FOR EXCELLENCE" DECEMBER 10, 1987

## THANK YOU JERRY. FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO

KNOW THE HISTORY OF REHABILITATION IN AMERICA,

YOU UNDERSTAND WHAT AN HONOR IT IS TO SHARE THE

PODIUM WITH JERRY MILBANK.

THE MILBANK FAMILY PIONEERED THE CONCEPT OF INTEGRATED REHABILITATIVE SERVICES FOR THE DISABLED WITH THE NATION'S FIRST PRIVATE FACILITY BACK IN 1917. THAT TRADITION CONTINUES TODAY IN THE J.M. FOUNDATION "SEARCH FOR EXCELLENCE." THE FOUNDATION'S NATIONAL AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE ARE UNIQUE: FOR THE FIRST TIME, PROGRAMMATIC EXCELLENCE IS BEING MEASURED BY COMPUTER TO HELP GUARANTEE AN OBJECTIVE REVIEW. WINNERS ARE THEN SELECTED BY JUDGES WHO HAVE DISTINGUISHED THEMSELVES IN THE FIELD OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION.

AS JERRY PROMISED, THERE WILL BE NO LONG SPEECHES TODAY. BUT THERE IS ONE ISSUE THAT IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT TO ME, SO ON BEHALF OF THE J.M. FOUNDATION --<u>AND</u> THE DOLE FOUNDATION FOR EMPLOYMENT OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES--I'D LIKE TO MAKE A FEW BRIEF, CRITICAL POINTS.

# FIRST, THIS COUNTRY NEEDS TO DO A MUCH

## BETTER JOB INTEGRATING INDIVIDUALS WITH

DISABILITIES INTO MAINSTREAM AMERICA. LAST YEAR,

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL ON THE HANDICAPPED

CONDUCTED A LANDMARK STUDY THAT PRODUCED

SOME STARTLING RESULTS: TWO-THIRDS OF ALL

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES, BETWEEN THE AGES OF

16 AND 64 ARE NOT WORKING.



THAT MEANS THERE ARE EIGHT AND A HALF MILLION PEOPLE IN THIS COUNTRY WHO ARE READY, WILLING AND ABLE TO WORK, BUT NEED HELP TO FIND EMPLOYMENT. INDEED, THE REPORT'S MAJOR FINDING WORKING IS PERHAPS THE TRUEST IS THAT NOT DEFINITION OF WHAT IT MEANS TO BE DISABLED. WE MUST DO BETTER, AND IN MY VIEW, THE **VOCATIONAL FACILITIES REPRESENTED HERE TODAY** WILL PLAY A MAJOR ROLE IN TURNING THOSE STATISTICS AROUND.

AS ONE WHO CALLS THE FEDERAL DEFICIT "PUBLIC ENEMY #1", I CAN TELL YOU HOW IMPORTANT IT IS FOR VOCATIONAL PROFESSIONAL TO LEARN FROM THE EXCELLENT PROGRAMS HERE TODAY.
