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NOW, THE DREAM IS A REALITY. THE DOLE
FOUNDATION -- THANKS TO YOU -- IS AN ACTIVE,
RESPECTED VOICE, WORKING FOR CHANGE AND
PROMOTING HOPE AND OPPORTUNITY. AND WE'VE
ACCOMPLISHED ALL OF THIS BY CHANGING THE RULES:
WE DON'T FOLLOW TIRED OLD FORMULAS; THE DOLE
FOUNDATION IS COMMITTED TO NEW ANSWERS, NEW
IDEAS, AND NEW LEADERSHIP FOR THE DISABLED.

AT THE DOLE FOUNDATION, WE DON'T GIVE
HANDOUTS. WE HELP PEOPLE HELP THEMSELVES.

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I BELIEVE WE ARE IN THE DAWN OF A NEW ERA FOR
PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. THERE'S A WELCOME --
AND LONG OVERDUE -- NEW AWARENESS ON THE
SCENE TODAY. THE GOVERNMENT, FOR EXAMPLE, HAS
FINALLY GROWN MORE SENSITIVE TO THE NEEDS OF THE
DISABLED.

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WE HAVE INSISTED ON BETTER ACCESS TO AIRLINES
AND MASS TRANSPORTATION; INSISTED ON
AFFORDABLE AND APPROPRIATE HOUSING; AND
INSISTED ON INCREASED ACCESS TO POLLING PLACES
SO THE DISABLED CAN EXERCISE THEIR BASIC RIGHT TO
VOTE.

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AND WE ARE BEGINNING TO SEE POSITIVE
MOVEMENT IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR AS WELL. MORE
EMPLOYERS, SUCH AS THOSE OF YOU IN THIS AUDIENCE,
NOW REALIZE THAT HIRING PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES
MAKES GOOD BUSINESS SENSE. SMALL BUSINESSES
AND MAJOR CORPORATIONS NEED A STEADY SOURCE
OF NEW EMPLOYEES, AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES
ARE READY, ABLE AND WILLING TO DO THE JOB.

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AS WE USHER IN THIS NEW ERA FOR PERSONS WITH
DISABILITIES, WE MUST BE AWARE THAT OBSTACLES TO
EMPLOYMENT STILL EXIST: MORE TRAINING IS NEEDED
TO HELP THE DISABLED PREPARE FOR COMPETITIVE
WORK; MANY EMPLOYERS STILL SHY AWAY FROM HIRING
THE DISABLED BECAUSE OF UNREASONABLE FEARS, OR
MISUNDERSTANDING; AND MANY PHYSICAL BARRIERS
STILL BLOCK OUR WAY TO THE WORKPLACE.

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THE DOLE FOUNDATION IS TACKLING THESE
OBSTACLES HEAD-ON; AND WE'RE PLAYING TO WIN!
OUR PROGRESSIVE GRANTS PROGRAM PROVIDES
FUNDS TO INNOVATIVE GRASSROOTS ORGANIZATIONS
THAT HELP TRAIN AND PLACE DISABLED AMERICANS IN
MEANINGFUL JOBS AT RESPECTABLE WAGES. LET ME

AT THE DOLE FOUNDATION, WE DON'T GIVE HANDOUTS. WE PROVIDE THE NECESSARY ASSISTANCE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES TO HELP THEMSELVES. TO OVERCOME THEIR OBSTACLES AND TAKE PART IN THE AMERICAN ECONOMY.

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I BELIEVE THE DAWN IS BREAKING ON A NEW ERA FOR
PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. IN THE PAST FEW YEARS
THOSE OF US IN GOVERNMENT HAVE GROWN MORE
UNDERSTANDING OF THE NEEDS OF THE DISABLED. WE HAVE
WORKED FOR BETTER ACCESS TO AIRLINES AND MASS
TRANSPORTATION, AFFORDABLE AND APPROPRIATE HOUSING,
AND INCREASED ACCESS TO POLLING PLACES TO ENABLE
PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES TO EXERCISE THEIR RIGHT TO
VOTE.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN. I WOULD LIKE TO BEGIN TONIGHT'S BRIEF PROGRAM WITH TWO WORDS: THANK YOU. THANKS TO YOU, THE DOLE FOUNDATION IS ENJOYING ITS MOST SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISING EVENT IN OUR HISTORY. THANKS TO YOU, IN A SINGLE YEAR WE HAVE DOUBLED THE GRANTS AWARDED TO ORGANIZATIONS HELPING PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN? IT MEANS THAT FOR EVERY ONE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY SIX DOLLARS WE EXPEND IN GRANTS, ONE PERSON IS TRAINED AND EMPLOYED. SIMPLE ARITHMETIC TELLS YOU QUICKLY THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE TO WHOM YOU HAVE GIVEN A QUALITY LIFE THROUGH YOUR CONTRIBUTION...NOT TO MENTION THE IMPACT ON THE MORE THAN \$62 BILLION SUBSIDIZED FOR PROGRAMS AND PENSIONS TO DISABLED AMERICANS. THANKS TO YOUR COMMITMENT AND SUPPORT WE ARE MOVING FORWARD TO ACHIEVE GREATER THINGS, TO EXPAND OUR EFFORTS, AND TO HELP PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES HELP THEMSELVES.

IN THE AUDIENCE TONIGHT I SEE MANY FRIENDS OF THE DOLE FOUNDATION. I SEE MANY PEOPLE WHOSE COMPANIES HAVE CONTRIBUTED TO THE SUCCESS OF OUR MISSION. SOME HAVE GIVEN MONEY. SOME HAVE GIVEN EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES. OTHERS HAVE GIVEN OF THEIR TIME. I ALSO SEE MANY REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PROGRAMS WE HAVE FUNDED AND THE BENEFICIARIES OF SOME OF THOSE PROGRAMS. TONIGHT WE THANK ALL OF YOU BECAUSE YOU KEEP THE DREAM ALIVE.

YOU KEEP ALIVE THE DREAM THAT AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES WILL ONE DAY BE ABLE TO ENTER THE LABOR FORCE ON AN EQUAL FOOTING WITH THEIR NON-DISABLED COUNTERPARTS. THAT ONE DAY WE WILL NOT BE TALKING ABOUT A 67-PERCENT UNEMPLOYMENT RATE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. THAT ONE DAY WE WON'T HAVE TO PRICK AMERICA'S CONSCIENCE WITH THE FACT THAT 80-PERCENT OF WOMEN WITH DISABILITIES IN THIS COUNTRY ARE OUT-OF-WORK OR THAT 82-PERCENT OF OUR BLACK AMERICANS ARE WITHOUT JOBS.

YOU KEEP ALIVE THE DREAM THAT ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS THE DOLE FOUNDATION WILL HELP PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES OVERCOME THESE OBSTACLES AND BECOME INDEPENDENT AND SELF-SUFFICIENT MEMBERS OF SOCIETY.

TOGETHER WE ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE. DOLE FOUNDATION GRANTS STRETCH FROM ALASKA TO FLORIDA. HUNDREDS OF INDIVIDUALS HAVE BENEFITTED FROM YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS AND MANY MORE WILL IN THE MONTHS TO COME. YOUR FUNDS ARE GIVING AUTISTIC YOUTHS IN CALIFORNIA THE HOPE OF EMPLOYMENT. PEOPLE WITH CEREBRAL PALSY IN PORTLAND, OREGON; PEOPLE WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES IN IOWA CITY, IOWA; DISABLED YOUTHS IN RESTON, VIRGINIA AND ELDERLY AMERICANS IN NEW YORK CITY ALL HAVE BEEN GIVEN A RAY OF HOPE THROUGH YOUR ASSISTANCE.

I AM PROUD TO SAY THAT THE DOLE FOUNDATION IS GROWING. IN THE PAST FEW YEARS WE HAVE ESTABLISHED OURSELVES AS A NATIONAL LEADER IN THE EFFORT TO ENHANCE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES. WHILE OUR GRANTS PROGRAM WILL CONTINUE TO PROSPER UNABATED, WE ARE EXPANDING OUR BASE. IN THE NEXT FEW MONTHS WE WILL DEVELOP PARTNERSHIPS WITH COMMUNITY FOUNDATIONS, SERVICE PROVIDERS, AND LOCAL BUSINESSES TO ENCOURAGE THE GROWTH OF DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS IN CITIES AND TOWNS ACROSS AMERICA. WE ARE WORKING WITH MAJOR CORPORATIONS ON A NATIONAL PROJECT THAT HAS THE POTENTIAL TO MATCH EMPLOYER NEEDS WITH THE NEEDS OF THOUSANDS OF DISABLED AMERICANS.

WE WILL BE WORKING TO CHANGE ATTITUDES IN THE WORKPLACE OF THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN RELUCTANT TO CHANGE, WE PLAN TO SHOWCASE ASSISTIVE DEVICES AND PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL TO EMPLOYERS. YOU AND OTHER CORPORATIONS ACROSS THE NATION WILL BE HELPING TO MAKE THESE DREAMS COME TRUE AS ALL OF THESE ACTIONS LEAD TO EMPLOYMENT.

TONIGHT, THE DOLE FOUNDATION IS NOT ONLY PAYING TRIBUTE TO ITS CONTRIBUTORS BUT ALSO TO A CORPORATION AND AN INDIVIDUAL WHO SERVE AS AN EXAMPLE FOR THE REST OF US. AT&T HAS A LONG RECORD OF LEADERSHIP IN HIRING AND PROVIDING SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. THEY, ALONG WITH PREVIOUS LEADERSHIP AWARD WINNERS UNITED AIRLINES AND IBM, SET A HIGH STANDARD IN MEETING THE NEEDS

OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. WE WILL ALSO PAY TRIBUTE TONIGHT TO KARYL BERGER, A YOUNG WOMAN WHO HAS USED HER EXPERIENCE WITH A DOLE FOUNDATION-FUNDED PROGRAM TO OBTAIN A JOB AND BECOME INDEPENDENT.
