I will furnish you a separate list of new contributors immediately after June 16. Let me know if you need anything further.







YOU KEEP ALIVE THE DREAM THAT AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES WILL ONE DAY BE ABLE TO ENTER THE LABOR FORCE ON AN EQUAL FOOTING WITH THEIR NON-DISABLED COUNTERPARTS. THAT ONE DAY WE WILL NOT BE TALKING ABOUT A 67-PERCENT UNEMPLOYMENT RATE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. THAT ONE DAY WE WON'T HAVE TO PRICK AMERICA'S CONSCIENCE WITH THE FACT THAT 80-PERCENT OF WOMEN WITH DISABILITIES IN THIS COUNTRY ARE OUT-OF-WORK OR THAT 82-PERCENT OF OUR BLACK AMERICANS ARE WITHOUT JOBS.

YOU KEEP ALIVE THE DREAM THAT ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS THE DOLE FOUNDATION WILL HELP PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES OVERCOME THESE OBSTACLES AND BECOME INDEPENDENT AND SELF-SUFFICIENT MEMBERS OF SOCIETY.

TOGETHER WE ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE. DOLE FOUNDATION GRANTS
STRETCH FROM ALASKA TO FLORIDA. HUNDREDS OF INDIVIDUALS HAVE
BENEFITTED FROM YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS AND MANY MORE WILL IN THE

YOU AND OTHER CORPORATIONS ACROSS THE NATION WILL BE HELPING TO MAKE THESE DREAMS COME TRUE AS ALL OF THESE ACTIONS LEAD TO EMPLOYMENT.

WE HAVE WORKED FOR BETTER ACCESS TO AIRLINES AND MASS TRANSPORTATION, AFFORDABLE AND APPROPRIATE HOUSING, AND INCREASED ACCESS TO POLLING PLACES TO ENABLE PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES TO EXERCISE THEIR RIGHT TO VOTE.
