SENATE LEADERSHIP AWARD
JEWISH COMMUNITY RELATIONS COUNCIL OF NEW YORK
FEBRUARY 26, 1989

IT IS AN HONOR FOR ME TO ACCEPT THIS AWARD,
FOR REASONS THAT GO BEYOND THE NORMAL SENSE OF
GRATIFICATION AT BEING SINGLED OUT FOR THIS KIND OF
IMPORTANT COMMENDATION.

IT IS AN HONOR BECAUSE THE AWARD COMES FROM THIS DISTINGUISHED COUNCIL, WHOSE WORK HAS MEANT SO MUCH, TO SO MANY IN NEED. YOUR 60 CONSTITUENT ORGANIZATIONS COLLECTIVELY TACKLE THE FULL RANGE OF HUMAN AND SOCIAL CHALLENGES CONFRONTING OUR SOCIETY -- EDUCATION, HEALTH, CHILD WELFARE, DRUGS, INTERPERSONAL PROBLEMS, AND ALL THE REST. THE COUNCIL'S ACTIVITIES CAPTURE AND REFLECT THE SPIRIT THAT PRESIDENT BUSH HAS ARTICULATED, IN HIS

CALL FOR A "KINDER, GENTLER NATION;" THE SAME
SPIRIT CAPSULIZED IN A HEBREW WORD, "TZADIK"
(pronounced: TSAH-dick) -- CARING FOR YOUR OWN.

IT IS A SPECIAL HONOR FOR ME TO RECEIVE THIS
AWARD, TOO, BECAUSE IT BEARS THE NAME OF A GREAT

HE LEFT HIS MARK; BY HIS LEADERSHIP, TO INSURE THAT AMERICA'S STRENGTH WOULD BE SECOND TO NONE, HER DEFENSES UP TO EVERY CHALLENGE.

BUT THOSE OF US WHO WERE PRIVILEGED TO SERVE WITH "SCOOP" JACKSON MEASURE HIS ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN A MORE PERSONAL WAY, TOO: BY THOSE MANY, MANY TIMES -- IN THE COURSE OF OUR DELIBERATIONS AND DEBATES -- WHEN WE WISH HE COULD BE WITH US AGAIN, TO ADD HIS WISDOM AND COMMON SENSE TO OUR CONSIDERATION OF SOME VEXSOME ISSUE.

"SCOOP" JACKSON WAS A DEMOCRAT, IN THE
ROOSEVELT-TRUMAN TRADITIONS OF HIS PARTY. A
DEMOCRAT WHO WAS DEDICATED TO THE PROPOSITION
THAT THERE IS A MUCH GREATER INTEREST THAN PARTY
INTEREST; THERE IS A NATIONAL INTEREST -- AN
AMERICAN INTEREST.

SADLY, DANGEROUSLY, WE HAVE GOTTEN AWAY
FROM THE TRADITION THAT POLITICS OUGHT TO "STOP AT
THE WATER'S EDGE." IT IS TIME TO RETURN TO THAT
TRADITION.

IN CONFRONTING AND CHALLENGING TYRANNY, ALL AMERICANS MUST STAND TOGETHER. THE PRESIDENT -- WHETHER REPUBLICAN OR DEMOCRAT -- IS THE PRESIDENT OF ALL THE PEOPLE; HE DESERVES OUR RESPECT AT ALL TIMES; AND OUR SUPPORT WHEN THE "CHIPS ARE REALLY DOWN" FOR AMERICA.

IN APPROACHING THE NEW OPPORTUNITIES AND CHANGING CHALLENGES OF DEALING WITH THE SOVIET UNION, THE PRESIDENT DESERVES, AND NEEDS, OUR COUNSEL AND OUR SUPPORT, TOO.

MAKE NO MISTAKE ABOUT IT: GORBACHEV IS A REAL
HAND-FULL. I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO SIT WITH HIM
FOR SEVERAL HOURS IN MOSCOW, ON THE OCCASION OF
THE SIGNING OF THE INF TREATY. HE IS SMART; HE IS
TOUGH; AND HE IS JUST AS DETERMINED AS ANY OF HIS
PREDECESSORS TO ACHIEVE THE GOALS OF THE SOVIET
STATE.

CIRCUMSTANCES, SOME GENUINELY NEW THINKING,
AND GORBACHEV'S STRIKINGLY NEW STYLE HAVE
ALREADY LED TO SOME CHANGES IN SOVIET POLICIES.
THE INF TREATY WAS ONE EXAMPLE; THE WITHDRAWAL
FROM AFGHANISTAN ANOTHER. IN THE HUMAN RIGHTS
FIELD -- SOMETHING OF SPECIAL INTEREST TO EVERYONE
IN THIS ROOM -- THERE HAS BEEN REAL PROGRESS, TOO.
WE WELCOME IT, NO MATTER WHAT MOTIVATED IT.

BUT IN ALL THESE AREAS -- ARMS CONTROL,
REGIONAL CONFLICTS, HUMAN RIGHTS -- MUCH MORE
REMAINS TO BE DONE. WHILE KEEPING THE DOORS OPEN
TO DIALOGUE, AND OUR MINDS OPEN TO NEW IDEAS --
LET'S ALSO KEEP OUR EYES WIDE OPEN TO THE
CONTINUING REALITIES OF SOVIET REPRESSION, AND THE
CONTINUING THREAT OF A MASSIVE SOVIET MILITARY
MACHINE.

THE SAME BASIC POSTURE OF CREATIVE BUT
HARD-HEADED THINKING MUST ALSO CONDITION OUR
DIPLOMACY TOWARD ANOTHER AREA OF MAJOR
CONCERN TO THIS AUDIENCE, THE MIDDLE EAST. ISRAEL
REMAINS OUR MOST IMPORTANT ALLY AND FRIEND IN
THAT REGION. WE WILL STAND BY ISRAEL, BECAUSE IT IS
RIGHT AND BECAUSE IT IS IN OUR INTEREST, AMERICA'S
INTEREST. THAT HASN'T CHANGED, AND WON'T.

BUT THERE ARE SOME WINDS OF CHANGE BLOWING
IN THAT REGION, TOO. JUST THIS WEEK, WE SAW THE
SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER SITTING DOWN WITH THE
ISRAELI FOREIGN MINISTER. THEY DIDN'T AGREE -- BUT
THEY TALKED.

WE ARE TALKING, TOO, TO THE P.L.O. FRANKLY,
SOME OF US HAVE QUESTIONED WHETHER NOW WAS
PRECISELY THE RIGHT TIME TO MAKE THAT MOVE. BUT
THE FACT IS, THOSE TALKS GO FORWARD. AND THEY

GO FORWARD ALONGSIDE OTHER, MORE SUBTLE
CHANGES; CHANGES OF WHICH ALL OF US -- INCLUDING
THOSE OF US FIRMLY COMMITTED TO STRONG
U.S.-ISRAELI RELATIONS -- MUST BE AWARE. IN THE FACE
OF THE CONTINUING REPORTS OF NEW TRAGEDIES AND
VIOLENCE COMING FROM ALL SIDES ON THE WEST BANK
AND GAZA, WE MUST FACE THIS FACT: THERE ARE
SHIFTING PERCEPTIONS AND OPINIONS, IN WORLD
OPINION, IN THE MIDDLE EAST, IN ISRAEL AND EVEN IN
THE U.S. I SEE THESE NEW "RUMBLINGS" OF CONCERN
ON CAPITOL HILL.

SOME WAY MUST BE FOUND TO DEFUSE THE
SITUATION ON THE WEST BANK AND GAZA THAT GOES
BEYOND JUST THE CONSTANT CHAIN OF VIOLENT
ACTION-AND-REACTION. SOME WAY MUST BE FOUND TO
START A DIALOGUE, AND A BROADER POLITICAL
PROCESS, THAT WILL RESTORE ORDER AND PROVIDE
SOME SEMBLANCE OF HOPE THAT THE LEGITIMATE
CONCERNS OF ALL CONCERNED CAN BE ADDRESSED.

AND LET ME SAY JUST ONE BRIEF WORD, TOO,
ABOUT ANOTHER MAJOR PROBLEM, WORLDWIDE IN
SCOPE, BUT FOCUSED NOW IN THE MIDDLE EAST: THE
DEADLY SPREAD OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS, AND THE
MEANS TO DELIVER THEM OVER LONG DISTANCES.
THERE IS NO GREATER, REAL WORLD THREAT TO ISRAEL'S
SECURITY, AND TO AMERICAN INTERESTS, THAN THE
PROSPECT THAT LUNATICS LIKE QADAFFI MIGHT GET
THEIR HANDS ON LARGE STOCKS OF CHEMICAL
WEAPONS, AND MASTER THE TECHNIQUES TO DELIVER
THOSE WEAPONS THROUGHOUT THE MIDDLE EAST.

IT IS TIME TO SAY TO THOSE NATIONS WHO SEEK TO
ACQUIRE, OR CONTEMPLATE THE USE OF, CHEMICAL
WEAPONS: AMERICA WILL NOT STAND FOR IT.

IT IS TIME TO SAY TO THOSE PRIVATE COMPANIES
WHO ARE HELPING QADAFFI AND THE OTHERS BUILD
THESE WEAPONS: AMERICA WILL NOT STAND FOR IT.

ALL OF US IN CONGRESS, IN THE GOVERNMENT AND
IN THIS COUNTRY: WE SHARE AN ABHORRENCE TO THE
QADAFFIS OF THE WORLD, AND AN INFORMED FEAR

ABOUT THE DANGERS OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS. IT IS TIME FOR BIPARTISAN ACTION TO ARTICULATE THAT FEELING IN LAW, AND TO PUT BEHIND IT ALL THE FORCE OF AMERICAN POWER, MILITARY AND ECONOMIC.

FINALLY, WE NEED THAT SAME KIND BIPARTISANSHIP, AND COURAGEOUS DETERMINATION, IF WE ARE TO SUCCESSFULLY ATTACK ANOTHER GREAT AND IMMEDIATE THREAT TO OUR NATIONAL SECURITY AND WELL-BEING, THE FEDERAL BUDGET DEFICIT. I AM

CONVINCED THAT PRESIDENT BUSH SINCERELY WANTS TO WORK WITH CONGRESS TO DEAL WITH THE BUDGET CRISIS. HE HAS HELD OUT HIS HAND, AND THERE IS NOTHING UP HIS SLEEVE. I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH HIM, AND WITH SENATORS AND CONGRESSMEN ON BOTH SIDES OF THE AISLE, TOWARD THAT END.

WE CAN DO IT -- ALL OF IT. TWO OF THE PAST RECIPIENTS OF THIS AWARD -- DAN INOUE AND HOWELL HEFLIN -- ARE LIVING EXAMPLES OF THE KIND OF

COMMON-SENSE, BIPARTISAN APPROACH THAT CAN
MAKE IT HAPPEN. LIKE "SCOOP" JACKSON, THEY ARE
DEMOCRATS WHO WILL MEET A REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT
HALF-WAY.

PAT MOYNIHAN IS HERE TODAY; NO ONE KNOWS
MORE ABOUT WORKING CONSTRUCTIVELY AND IN A
BIPARTISAN WAY ON MAJOR ISSUES. IN FACT, HE AND I
HAVE WORKED TOGETHER ON SO MANY IMPORTANT
THINGS, HE PUT ME IN HIS CAMPAIGN VIDEO.

WE HAVE MANY OF THE SAME KIND OF SENATOR ON MY SIDE OF THE AISLE. NEW YORK'S OWN SENATOR, AL D'AMATO, IS HERE TODAY. HE KNOWS WHEN TO ACT LIKE THE OUTSTANDING REPUBLICAN THAT HE IS; AND HE KNOWS WHEN IT IS TIME -- WHEN ISSUES LIKE TERRORISM, OR DEALING WITH DICTATORS LIKE NORIEGA, OR GRAPPLING WITH SCOURGES LIKE OUR DRUG EPIDEMIC ARE ON THE TABLE -- TO PUT PARTISAN IDENTIFICATION ASIDE, AND DEAL ONLY FROM THE STANDPOINT OF THE NATIONAL INTEREST.

ALL OF US MUST FOLLOW THAT SAME EXAMPLE. WE
HAVE TO WORK TOGETHER. TOO MUCH IS AT STAKE --
OUR COUNTRY, OUR FUTURE, OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE.
WE HAVE TO WORK TOGETHER IN THE SPIRIT OF
"TAKE CARE OF YOUR OWN," OF "TZADIK," THAT
CHARACTERIZES THIS COUNCIL. IN THE SPIRIT OF
BIPARTISANSHIP AND NATIONAL-INTEREST-ABOVE-ALL,
THAT WAS THE HALLMARK OF "SCOOP" JACKSON'S LIFE.

THAT IS THE CHALLENGE THAT WE ALL HAVE. THAT IS
THE INSPIRATION I TAKE FROM RECEIVING THIS AWARD.

SO, IN CLOSING, I THANK YOU AGAIN -- FOR COMING
THIS MORNING, FOR HONORING ME WITH THIS GREAT
AWARD, AND ABOVE ALL FOR YOUR CONTINUING
EFFORTS TO TRULY MAKE THIS A KINDER AND GENTLER
NATION.

SADLY, DANGEROUSLY, WE HAVE GOTTEN AWAY FROM THE TRADITION THAT POLITICS OUGHT TO "STOP AT THE WATER'S EDGE." IT IS TIME TO RETURN TO THAT TRADITION.

IN CONFRONTING AND CHALLENGING TYRANNY, ALL AMERICANS MUST STAND TOGETHER. THE PRESIDENT -- WHETHER REPUBLICAN OR DEMOCRAT -- IS THE PRESIDENT OF ALL THE PEOPLE; HE DESERVES OUR RESPECT AT ALL TIMES; AND OUR SUPPORT WHEN THE "CHIPS ARE REALLY DOWN" FOR AMERICA.

IN APPROACHING THE NEW OPPORTUNITIES AND CHANGING CHALLENGES OF DEALING WITH THE SOVIET UNION, THE PRESIDENT DESERVES, AND NEEDS, OUR COUNSEL AND OUR SUPPORT, TOO.

MAKE NO MISTAKE ABOUT IT: GORBACHEV IS A REAL
HAND-FULL. I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO SIT WITH HIM
FOR SEVERAL HOURS IN MOSCOW, ON THE OCCASION OF
THE SIGNING OF THE INF TREATY. HE IS SMART; HE IS
TOUGH; AND HE IS JUST AS DETERMINED AS ANY OF HIS
PREDECESSORS TO ACHIEVE THE GOALS OF THE SOVIET
STATE.

CIRCUMSTANCES, SOME GENUINELY NEW THINKING,
AND GORBACHEV'S STRIKINGLY NEW STYLE HAVE
ALREADY LED TO SOME CHANGES IN SOVIET POLICIES.
THE INF TREATY WAS ONE EXAMPLE; THE WITHDRAWAL
FROM AFGHANISTAN ANOTHER. IN THE HUMAN RIGHTS
FIELD -- SOMETHING OF SPECIAL INTEREST TO EVERYONE
IN THIS ROOM -- THERE HAS BEEN REAL PROGRESS, TOO.
WE WELCOME IT, NO MATTER WHAT MOTIVATED IT.

BUT IN ALL THESE AREAS -- ARMS CONTROL,
REGIONAL CONFLICTS, HUMAN RIGHTS -- MUCH MORE
REMAINS TO BE DONE. WHILE KEEPING THE DOORS OPEN
TO DIALOGUE, AND OUR MINDS OPEN TO NEW IDEAS --
LET'S ALSO KEEP OUR EYES WIDE OPEN TO THE
CONTINUING REALITIES OF SOVIET REPRESSION, AND THE
CONTINUING THREAT OF A MASSIVE SOVIET MILITARY
MACHINE.

THE SAME BASIC POSTURE OF CREATIVE BUT
HARD-HEADED THINKING MUST ALSO CONDITION OUR
DIPLOMACY TOWARD ANOTHER AREA OF MAJOR
CONCERN TO THIS AUDIENCE, THE MIDDLE EAST. ISRAEL
REMAINS OUR MOST IMPORTANT ALLY AND FRIEND IN
THAT REGION. WE WILL STAND BY ISRAEL, BECAUSE IT IS
RIGHT AND BECAUSE IT IS IN OUR INTEREST, AMERICA'S
INTEREST. THAT HASN'T CHANGED, AND WON'T.

BUT THERE ARE SOME WINDS OF CHANGE BLOWING
IN THAT REGION, TOO. JUST THIS WEEK, WE SAW THE
SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER SITTING DOWN WITH THE
ISRAELI FOREIGN MINISTER. THEY DIDN'T AGREE -- BUT
THEY TALKED.

WE ARE TALKING, TOO, TO THE P.L.O. FRANKLY,
SOME OF US HAVE QUESTIONED WHETHER NOW WAS
PRECISELY THE RIGHT TIME TO MAKE THAT MOVE. BUT
THE FACT IS, THOSE TALKS GO FORWARD. AND THEY

GO FORWARD ALONGSIDE OTHER, MORE SUBTLE
CHANGES; CHANGES OF WHICH ALL OF US -- INCLUDING
THOSE OF US FIRMLY COMMITTED TO STRONG
U.S.-ISRAELI RELATIONS -- MUST BE AWARE. IN THE FACE
OF THE CONTINUING REPORTS OF NEW TRAGEDIES AND
VIOLENCE COMING FROM ALL SIDES ON THE WEST BANK
AND GAZA, WE MUST FACE THIS FACT: THERE ARE
SHIFTING PERCEPTIONS AND OPINIONS, IN WORLD
OPINION, IN THE MIDDLE EAST, IN ISRAEL AND EVEN IN
THE U.S. I SEE THESE NEW "RUMBLINGS" OF CONCERN
ON CAPITOL HILL.

SOME WAY MUST BE FOUND TO DEFUSE THE
SITUATION ON THE WEST BANK AND GAZA THAT GOES
BEYOND JUST THE CONSTANT CHAIN OF VIOLENT
ACTION-AND-REACTION. SOME WAY MUST BE FOUND TO
START A DIALOGUE, AND A BROADER POLITICAL
PROCESS, THAT WILL RESTORE ORDER AND PROVIDE
SOME SEMBLANCE OF HOPE THAT THE LEGITIMATE
CONCERNS OF ALL CONCERNED CAN BE ADDRESSED.

AND LET ME SAY JUST ONE BRIEF WORD, TOO,
ABOUT ANOTHER MAJOR PROBLEM, WORLDWIDE IN
SCOPE, BUT FOCUSED NOW IN THE MIDDLE EAST: THE
DEADLY SPREAD OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS, AND THE
MEANS TO DELIVER THEM OVER LONG DISTANCES.
THERE IS NO GREATER, REAL WORLD THREAT TO ISRAEL'S
SECURITY, AND TO AMERICAN INTERESTS, THAN THE
PROSPECT THAT LUNATICS LIKE QADAFFI MIGHT GET
THEIR HANDS ON LARGE STOCKS OF CHEMICAL
WEAPONS, AND MASTER THE TECHNIQUES TO DELIVER
THOSE WEAPONS THROUGHOUT THE MIDDLE EAST.

IT IS TIME TO SAY TO THOSE NATIONS WHO SEEK TO
ACQUIRE, OR CONTEMPLATE THE USE OF, CHEMICAL
WEAPONS: AMERICA WILL NOT STAND FOR IT.

IT IS TIME TO SAY TO THOSE PRIVATE COMPANIES
WHO ARE HELPING QADAFFI AND THE OTHERS BUILD
THESE WEAPONS: AMERICA WILL NOT STAND FOR IT.

ALL OF US IN CONGRESS, IN THE GOVERNMENT AND
IN THIS COUNTRY: WE SHARE AN ABHORRENCE TO THE
QADAFFIS OF THE WORLD, AND AN INFORMED FEAR

ABOUT THE DANGERS OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS. IT IS TIME FOR BIPARTISAN ACTION TO ARTICULATE THAT FEELING IN LAW, AND TO PUT BEHIND IT ALL THE FORCE OF AMERICAN POWER, MILITARY AND ECONOMIC.

FINALLY, WE NEED THAT SAME KIND BIPARTISANSHIP, AND COURAGEOUS DETERMINATION, IF WE ARE TO SUCCESSFULLY ATTACK ANOTHER GREAT AND IMMEDIATE THREAT TO OUR NATIONAL SECURITY AND WELL-BEING, THE FEDERAL BUDGET DEFICIT. I AM

CONVINCED THAT PRESIDENT BUSH SINCERELY WANTS TO WORK WITH CONGRESS TO DEAL WITH THE BUDGET CRISIS. HE HAS HELD OUT HIS HAND, AND THERE IS NOTHING UP HIS SLEEVE. I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH HIM, AND WITH SENATORS AND CONGRESSMEN ON BOTH SIDES OF THE AISLE, TOWARD THAT END.

WE CAN DO IT -- ALL OF IT. TWO OF THE PAST RECIPIENTS OF THIS AWARD -- DAN INOUE AND HOWELL HEFLIN -- ARE LIVING EXAMPLES OF THE KIND OF

COMMON-SENSE, BIPARTISAN APPROACH THAT CAN
MAKE IT HAPPEN. LIKE "SCOOP" JACKSON, THEY ARE
DEMOCRATS WHO WILL MEET A REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT
HALF-WAY.

PAT MOYNIHAN IS HERE TODAY; NO ONE KNOWS
MORE ABOUT WORKING CONSTRUCTIVELY AND IN A
BIPARTISAN WAY ON MAJOR ISSUES. IN FACT, HE AND I
HAVE WORKED TOGETHER ON SO MANY IMPORTANT
THINGS, HE PUT ME IN HIS CAMPAIGN VIDEO.

WE HAVE MANY OF THE SAME KIND OF SENATOR ON MY SIDE OF THE AISLE. NEW YORK'S OWN SENATOR, AL D'AMATO, IS HERE TODAY. HE KNOWS WHEN TO ACT LIKE THE OUTSTANDING REPUBLICAN THAT HE IS; AND HE KNOWS WHEN IT IS TIME -- WHEN ISSUES LIKE TERRORISM, OR DEALING WITH DICTATORS LIKE NORIEGA, OR GRAPPLING WITH SCOURGES LIKE OUR DRUG EPIDEMIC ARE ON THE TABLE -- TO PUT PARTISAN IDENTIFICATION ASIDE, AND DEAL ONLY FROM THE STANDPOINT OF THE NATIONAL INTEREST.

ALL OF US MUST FOLLOW THAT SAME EXAMPLE. WE
HAVE TO WORK TOGETHER. TOO MUCH IS AT STAKE --
OUR COUNTRY, OUR FUTURE, OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE.

WE HAVE TO WORK TOGETHER IN THE SPIRIT OF
"TAKE CARE OF YOUR OWN," OF "TZADIK," THAT
CHARACTERIZES THIS COUNCIL. IN THE SPIRIT OF
BIPARTISANSHIP AND NATIONAL-INTEREST-ABOVE-ALL,
THAT WAS THE HALLMARK OF "SCOOP" JACKSON'S LIFE.

THAT IS THE CHALLENGE THAT WE ALL HAVE. THAT IS
THE INSPIRATION I TAKE FROM RECEIVING THIS AWARD.

SO, IN CLOSING, I THANK YOU AGAIN -- FOR COMING
THIS MORNING, FOR HONORING ME WITH THIS GREAT
AWARD, AND ABOVE ALL FOR YOUR CONTINUING
EFFORTS TO TRULY MAKE THIS A KINDER AND GENTLER
NATION.
