RADAR. WE DON'T KNOW IF IT WILL FLY, BUT I

UNDERSTAND IT TAXIS JUST FINE.

BUT MANY SAY THE CONGRESS IS OFF TO A SLOW
START. WITH A NEW PRESIDENT AND ADMINISTRATION,
NEW MAJORITY LEADER IN THE SENATE, ETHICS
TROUBLES IN THE HOUSE WHICH LED TO A NEW LINEUP
IN THE DEMOCRATIC LEADERSHIP THERE, SPEED IN
LEGISLATION IS PROBABLY NOT LIKELY.

## LABOR ISSUES

THAT MAY BE GOOD NEWS TO SMALL BUSINESSES. THE DEMOCRATS STARTED THE YEAR WITH AN AGENDA TO RAISE THE MINIMUM WAGE TO \$4.65 PER HOUR, REQUIRE EMPLOYERS TO PROVIDE PARENTAL AND MEDICAL LEAVE, PROHIBIT SO-CALLED DOUBLE BREASTING BY EMPLOYERS OWNING BOTH UNION AND OPEN SHOP BUSINESSES, REQUIRE MEDICAL INSURANCE BE OFFERED BY ALL EMPLOYERS TO ALL EMPLOYEES, AND OTHER SEEMLY UNENDING "MANDATED BENEFITS."

SO FAR WE HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN KEEPING
THE LIBERALS FROM RUNNING YOUR BUSINESSES -RUNNING THEM INTO THE GROUND. BUT THE FIGHT IS
NOW JUST BEGINNING.

#### BUDGET

THEN, ON AUGUST 25, OMB WILL TAKE A "SNAPSHOT" OF THE DEFICIT. WITHOUT COMPLETING RECONCILIATION -- THE OMNIBUS BILL WHICH IS SUPPOSED TO CUT SPENDING -- THE SNAPSHOT WILL PROBABLY SHOW A DEFICIT IN FISCAL YEAR 1990 OF \$118 TO \$120 BILLION, WELL OVER THE \$100 BILLION DEFICIT ALLOWED UNDER GRAMM-RUDMAN-HOLLLINGS. HOWEVER, WE GET A \$10 BILLION CUSHION, AND WE WILL PROBABLY BE ABLE TO GET TO \$110 BILLION AND AVOID A SEQUESTER FOR NEXT YEAR.

THE REAL TROUBLE WILL BEGIN IN FISCAL YEAR

1991, WHEN WE ARE TO REDUCE THE DEFICIT TO \$65

BILLION. WE WILL PROBABLY BE FACED WITH CUTTING

UP TO \$50 BILLION OR EVEN \$70 BILLION -- A REAL TASK,

SINCE WE HAVE USED UP MOST OF THE SMOKE AND

MIRRORS.

THAT WILL BE THE TIME WHEN LIBERALS WILL INSIST
ON HUGE TAX INCREASES, INCREASES ON YOU AS
INDIVIDUALS AND YOU AS BUSINESS OWNERS.

## **TOBACCO TAXES**

ANOTHER, SMALLER TAX ITEM THAT YOU MIGHT HAVE HEARD ABOUT IS A PROPOSAL CONGRESSMAN ROSTENKOWSKI PUT IN THE HOUSE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE'S VERSION OF RECONCILIATION.

IT WOULD "EQUALIZE THE TAX ON PIPE TOBACCO,
SNUFF AND CHEWING TOBACCO WITH THAT OF
CIGARETTES -- TO \$2.67 PER POUND. CURRENTLY, PIPE
TOBACCO IS TAXED AT \$0.45 PER POUND, SNUFF AT
\$0.24 AND CHEWING TOBACCO AT \$0.08 PER POUND.
THE PROPOSAL WOULD RAISE \$105 MILLION IN FISCAL
YEAR 1990, AND RAISE YOUR COST OF DOING BUSINESS.

#### SUMMARY

IN CLOSING, LET ME AGAIN SAY THAT BEING WITH A
GROUP THAT IS SO CLOSE TO THE EVERYDAY AMERICAN
IS AN HONOR FOR ME. YOU KNOW THE PULSE BEAT OF
OUR CITIZENS, THE DIRECTION THEY WANT THEIR
GOVERNMENT TO TAKE. SO, I HOPE OUR VISIT HAS BEEN
BENEFICIAL TO BOTH OF US, AND TO OUR COUNTRY.

SUBJECT: TOBACCO DISTRIBUTORS


