

WHICH PRODUCES REAL SAVINGS EQUAL TO THOSE ACHIEVED UNDER THE BUDGET SEQUESTER FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE FISCAL YEAR. BECAUSE THE DEFENSE APPROPRIATIONS BILL, IN

PARTICULAR, IS EXPECTED TO PRODUCE SAVINGS IN SOME PENTAGON ACCOUNTS WHEN COMPARED TO OUR BASELINE -- LAST YEAR'S EXPENDITURES PLUS INFLATION -- AND THESE SAVINGS COUNT TOWARD THE SEQUESTER, WE NEED ONLY ANOTHER \$11-12 BILLION.

HOWEVER, ALTHOUGH THEY INITIATED THE CALL FOR 0 A "CLEAN" RECONCILIATION BILL ON THE SENATE FLOOR (WHICH LED TO THE POSTPONEMENT OF ACTION ON CAPITAL GAINS), THE DEMOCRATS ARE NOW TRYING TO INCLUDE MANY REVENUE-LOSING PROVISIONS IN THE CONFERENCE AGREEMENT. AND THE PRESIDENT HAS INDICATED THAT HE WILL NOT ACCEPT A RECONCILIATION BILL WHICH DEVIATES FROM THE DEFICIT REDUCTION PURPOSE OF THIS LEGISLATION.
