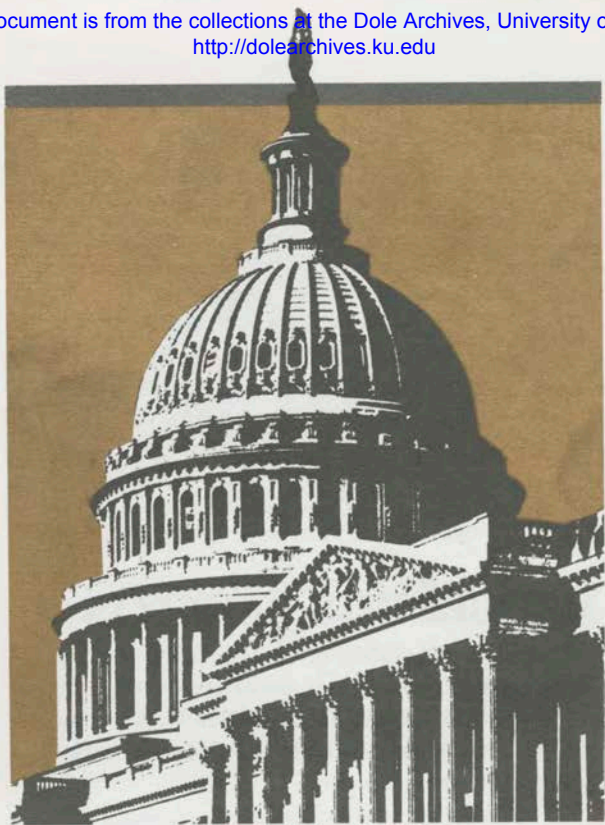

SUBJECT: SPEECH BEFORE THE PHIL GRAMM FOUNDING BOARD

As you know, you are scheduled to speak before the Phil Gramm Founding Board on Monday, March 5, at 9:30 a.m. You have been requested to speak for 30 minutes. Approximately 200 people will be in attendance (2/3 of the audience will be businessmen from Texas and 1/3 of the audience will be Washington representatives of corporate PACs).

The price of individual membership in the Founding Board is \$2,000.

The Founding Board meets once a year in Texas and once a year in Washington. Last September, you were a brunch speaker at the Founding Board's meeting in Dallas.

The event here in Washington is not a fundraiser. The opportunity to meet with Members of Congress is simply one of the benefits of Founding Board membership.

Other speakers at the Founding Board conference include Lee Atwater (who will speak immediately before you) and Strom Thurmond (who will speak immediately after you).

GOOD MORNING AND WELCOME TO WASHINGTON.

INTRODUCTION

I HAVE ALWAYS APPRECIATED THIS OPPORTUNITY TO
SPEAK TO THE FOUNDING BOARD. LAST SEPTEMBER, I
MADE THE TRIP TO DALLAS AS A BRUNCH SPEAKER.

THIS TIME I DON'T GET BRUNCH -- AND I DON'T KNOW
WHETHER TO CONSIDER THAT A REFLECTION ON THE
QUALITY OF MY REMARKS LAST YEAR.

PHIL GRAMM: A LEADER FOR BUDGET REFORM

IN THIS TOWN, THE NAME "PHIL GRAMM" IS
SYNONYMOUS WITH BUDGET INTEGRITY AND DEFICIT
REDUCTION. PHIL HAS ALWAYS BEEN A TRENCH
WARRIOR WHEN IT COMES TO THE BUDGET -- HE HAS
ALWAYS BEEN WILLING TO MAKE THE TOUGH BUDGET
CHOICES -- AND HE HAS BEEN A LEADER IN THE FIGHT TO
REDUCE THE BUDGET DEFICIT SINCE "DAY ONE" -- SINCE
THE DAY HE FIRST STEPPED FOOT ONTO THE SENATE
FLOOR.

AND IF YOU ARE CONCERNED ABOUT KEEPING THE
BUDGET DEFICIT DOWN, IF YOU WANT TO PREVENT THE
MORTGAGING OF AMERICA, THEN IT IS ABSOLUTELY
ESSENTIAL TO KEEP A STRAIGHTSHOOTER LIKE PHIL
GRAMM IN THE SENATE.

CONGRESS CAN AFFORD TO LOSE SOME OF ITS BAD
SPENDING HABITS, BUT IT CAN'T AFFORD TO LOSE PHIL
GRAMM'S INSPIRED LEADERSHIP.

THE BUDGET PROCESS

JUST OVER A MONTH AGO, PRESIDENT BUSH
SUBMITTED A BUDGET TO CONGRESS WHICH MEETS THE
1991 GRAMM-RUDMAN DEFICIT TARGET OF \$64 BILLION.
LET'S FACE IT: IT IS A REASONABLE PLAN, BUT IT IS
CERTAINLY NOT A BOLD ONE.

Revised and reissued 10/10/91

IT RELIES ON OPTIMISTIC ECONOMIC ASSUMPTIONS.

IT IGNORES AS MUCH AS \$40 BILLION IN WORKING
CAPITAL NEEDED TO ADMINISTER THE S&L BAILOUT. AND
IT INCLUDES THE USUAL EXPEDIENTS, SUCH AS ANOTHER
PAYROLL TAX SPEED-UP TO RAISE REVENUE.

AS MANY OF YOU KNOW, CONGRESS BASICALLY
TOOK A WALK ON THE DEFICIT LAST YEAR -- ALTHOUGH
WE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY, GIVEN THE ELECTION
MANDATE, TO ENACT SOME TOUGH PROGRAMS LIKE THE
FLEXIBLE FREEZE.

INSTEAD, WE SPENT 10 MONTHS AND DEVOTED OVER
60% OF OUR ROLL CALL VOTES IN THE SENATE TO
REDUCE THE DEFICIT BY ONLY \$16 BILLION. THIS YEAR,
WE NEED TO MAKE \$36 BILLION IN BUDGET CUTS -- MORE
THAN TWICE AS MUCH -- EVEN USING OMB'S OPTIMISTIC
ASSUMPTIONS ABOUT THE ECONOMY.

SO, YOU CAN SEE, WHY THE PROCESS IS SO
FRUSTRATING AND WHY THE BUDGET COMMITTEE
PREFERS TO FOCUS ON REFORMING THE
GRAMM-RUDMAN LAW -- ONCE AGAIN! IN FACT, THE
COMMITTEE WILL NOT EVEN BEGIN WORK ON A 1991
BUDGET RESOLUTION UNTIL AFTER THE MARCH RECESS,
ONE WEEK BEFORE ITS APRIL 1 DEADLINE.

SOCIAL SECURITY

LET ME TOUCH UPON ANOTHER TOPIC THAT HAS
BEEN IN THE HEADLINES RECENTLY.

SENATOR MOYNIHAN HIT UPON A SLOW NEWS DAY
WITH HIS PROPOSAL TO ELIMINATE THE SOCIAL SECURITY
TRUST FUND SURPLUS BY CUTTING PAYROLL TAXES.
PREDICTABLY, OTHER DEMOCRATS, LIKE SENATOR
HOLLINGS, IMMEDIATELY BEGAN CALLING FOR TAX
INCREASES TO PAY FOR THESE CUTS, THEREBY EXPOSING
THE REAL DANGER TO THE ECONOMY POSED BY THE
MOYNIHAN PLAN.

LAST TIME I LOOKED, SENATOR MOYNIHAN HAD ONLY
ONE VOTE -- HIS OWN -- BUT THE DEBATE OVER THE
MOYNIHAN PLAN IS LIKELY TO AT LEAST SLOW DOWN
ENACTMENT OF CAPITAL GAINS RELIEF.

CAPITAL GAINS

AS MOST OF YOU KNOW, THE PRESIDENT'S BUDGET CONTAINS A REVISED CAPITAL GAINS RATE REDUCTION PROPOSAL. UNDER THE PRESIDENT'S PROPOSAL, A 10% INCOME EXCLUSION WOULD BE EARNED IN EACH OF THE FIRST THREE YEARS THAT A CAPITAL ASSET IS HELD. IN ADDITION, THE PROPOSAL HAS BEEN BROADENED TO INCLUDE ALL CAPITAL ASSETS HELD BY INDIVIDUALS, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF COLLECTIBLES.

FINALLY, PRESIDENT BUSH HAS INDICATED THAT HE
IS WILLING TO WORK WITH MEMBERS OF CONGRESS,
WHO MAY WANT TO ADD CORPORATIONS OR INDEXING,
TO ENACT A PROGRAM THAT WILL ENCOURAGE
LONG-TERM INVESTMENT IN AMERICA.

IT IS THIS COMBINATION OF COMMITMENT AND
WILLINGNESS TO COMPROMISE WHICH ENSURES THAT
PRESIDENT BUSH WILL ULTIMATELY PREVAIL AND THAT
CAPITAL GAINS RELIEF WILL PASS THE CONGRESS THIS
YEAR.

SAVINGS INCENTIVES

THE PRESIDENT'S BUDGET ALSO PROPOSES THE
CREATION OF TAX-FREE SAVINGS ACCOUNTS. UNDER
THIS PROPOSAL -- WHICH WAS FIRST TRIED IN POST-WAR
JAPAN -- ALL INCOME EARNED ON FUNDS INVESTED IN A
FAMILY SAVINGS ACCOUNT WOULD BE TAX-FREE IF THE
FUNDS ARE NOT WITHDRAWN FOR AT LEAST SEVEN

YEARS.

THESE ACCOUNTS WILL ENCOURAGE LONG-TERM
SAVINGS BY LOW- AND MIDDLE-INCOME TAXPAYERS AND
PROVIDE CAPITAL FOR AMERICAN BUSINESS INVESTMENT
AND ECONOMIC GROWTH.

THE NEED TO INCREASE OUR POOR NATIONAL
SAVINGS RATE IS OBVIOUS. AND THIS NEED SHOULD
RESULT IN SOME FORM OF SAVINGS INCENTIVE
LEGISLATION LATER THIS YEAR.

EXCISE TAXES

THE PRESIDENT HAS MADE IT CLEAR THAT HE
CONSIDERS EXCISE TAX INCREASES -- EVEN A GAS TAX
INCREASE TO RESTORE OUR CRUMBLING BRIDGES AND
HIGHWAYS -- TO BE "DUCKS" WHICH WOULD VIOLATE HIS
"NO TAX" PLEDGE.

I KNOW THAT THE PRESIDENT'S COMMITMENT TO HIS
"NO TAX" PLEDGE -- AND PARTICULARLY TO NO GAS TAX
INCREASES -- IS A GREAT RELIEF TO MANY OF YOU IN THIS
TEXAN AUDIENCE. AND ALTHOUGH THERE HAVE BEEN
CALLS FOR INCREASES IN SO-CALLED "SIN TAXES" ON
ALCOHOL AND CIGARETTES TO FUND A VARIETY OF
SPENDING PROGRAMS -- SUCH AS THE WAR ON DRUGS --
THE PRESIDENT SHOWS NO SIGN OF RELENTING ON THIS
ISSUE.

CLEAN AIR COMPROMISE

PRESIDENT BUSH HAS MADE GOOD ON HIS
CAMPAIGN PROMISE TO BECOME THE ENVIRONMENTAL
PRESIDENT BY PROPOSING A \$19 BILLION REVISION TO
OUR CLEAN AIR LEGISLATION -- THE FIRST MAJOR
REVISION IN 12 YEARS.

IN A VICTORY FOR BIPARTISANSHIP, SENATE AND
WHITE HOUSE NEGOTIATORS AGREED LAST WEEK ON A
COMPROMISE PACKAGE THAT DEALS WITH SUCH TOUGH

CAMPAIGN FINANCE REFORM

I HOPE THAT THIS SPIRIT OF BIPARTISANSHIP WILL
SPILL-OVER INTO THE AREA OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE
REFORM, PARTICULARLY SINCE SENATOR MITCHELL HAS
ANNOUNCED HIS INTENTION TO TAKE UP CAMPAIGN
FINANCE REFORM LEGISLATION SOMETIME IN LATE
MARCH.

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, IF CONGRESS IS TO PASS
COMPREHENSIVE CAMPAIGN FINANCE REFORM
LEGISLATION THIS YEAR, IT MUST DO SO ON A BIPARTISAN
BASIS. AND IF PAST EXPERIENCE HAS TAUGHT US
ANYTHING, IT HAS TAUGHT US THAT PARTISANSHIP JUST
WON'T WORK WHEN IT COMES TO CLEANING UP THE
CAMPAIGN FINANCE MESS.

SO FAR, I HAVEN'T SEEN OR HEARD MUCH FROM THE DEMOCRATS. IF THEY ARE REALLY SERIOUS ABOUT SOLVING THE PROBLEMS PLAGUING OUR SYSTEM OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE -- THE ALARMINGLY HIGH RATE OF RE-ELECTION FOR INCUMBENTS, PARTICULARLY DEMOCRATIC INCUMBENTS, THE "MONEY CHASE" LEADING UP TO ELECTION DAY, THE GROWING PERCEPTION THAT MEMBERS OF CONGRESS ARE "BOUGHT AND PAID FOR" BY SPECIAL INTERESTS -- THEN THEY OUGHT TO GET BEHIND EITHER MY REFORM PROPOSAL OR THE PRESIDENT'S PROPOSAL, WHICH WAS INTRODUCED LAST YEAR.

CRIME LEGISLATION

ANOTHER POSSIBLE AREA FOR BIPARTISANSHIP
COULD BE COMPREHENSIVE CRIME LEGISLATION.
SENATORS THURMOND AND BIDEN HAVE INTRODUCED
COMPETING BILLS -- BUT SO FAR NO AGREEMENTS HAVE
BEEN MADE ON A BIPARTISAN CRIME PACKAGE.

I MIGHT ADD THAT PHIL GRAMM HAS BEEN THE
LEADER IN THE SENATE IN THE EFFORT TO RESOLVE OUR
NATION'S PRISON OVERCROWDING PROBLEM. AND I
KNOW THAT PHIL IS ANXIOUS FOR CONGRESS TO PASS
HIS LEGISLATION THAT WOULD SIGNIFICANTLY EXPAND
THE AMOUNT OF AVAILABLE PRISON SPACE WITHOUT
SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCING THE SIZE OF OUR WALLET
~~AND~~ POCKETBOOKS.

CONCLUSION

SINCE YOU HAVE A FULL LINE-UP OF SPEAKERS
TODAY, I DON'T WANT TO TAKE UP ANY MORE OF YOUR
TIME.

I WILL SAY, THOUGH, THAT THE PEOPLE OF TEXAS

"TEXAS GOLD" -- AND I URGE EVERYONE HERE TO WORK
HARD TO ENSURE PHIL'S RE-ELECTION LATER THIS YEAR.

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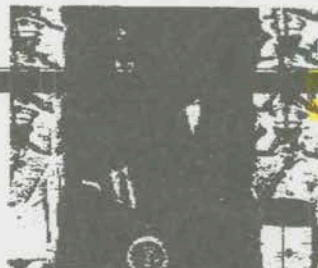
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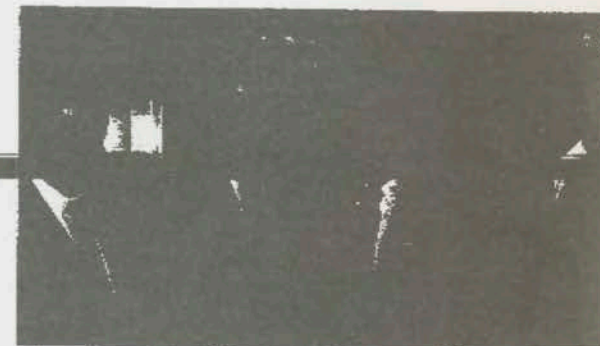
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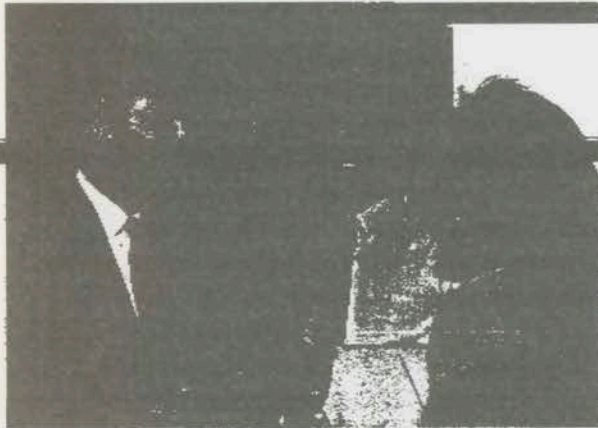
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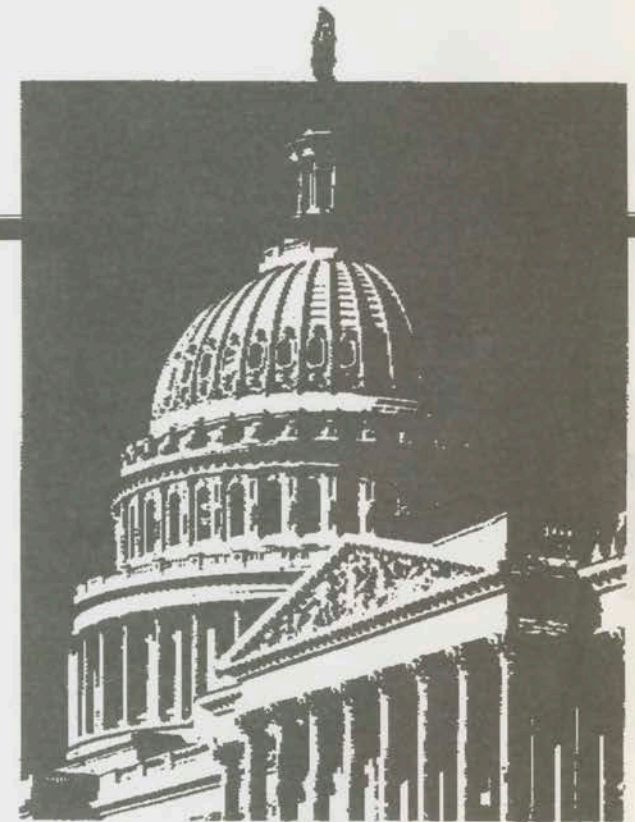
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
