GOOD WORK OVER THE PAST 15 YEARS IN PROMOTING PUBLIC SERVICE, AND GETTING YOUNG PEOPLE INVOLVED IN GOVERNMENT, BUSINESS AND EDUCATION -- AND OF COURSE I WANT TO RECOGNIZE THE STUDENTS HERE TONIGHT WHO HAVE SOUGHT OUT VALUABLE REAL—LIFE EXPERIENCE

INTERNSHIPS ARE A TWO-WAY STREET THAT BRING BENEFITS TO

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THOSE ON BOTH SIDES. AND THERE'S NO DOUBT ABOUT IT: INTERNS ARE EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TO US ON CAPITOL HILL. PERHAPS I REPRESENT ALL OF US IN THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE IN ACCEPTING THIS AWARD. WE ALL RELY ON INTERNS, AND I THINK WE ALL TAKE PRIDE IN

BEING ABLE TO GIVE STUDENTS ACCESS TO THE VALUABLE EXPERIENCE THAT DRAWS THEM TO WASHINGTON. AND WE COULDN'T DO IT NEARLY AS WELL, I MIGHT ADD, WITHOUT OUR NATION'S COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES WHO ENCOURAGE INTERNSHIPS BY GRANTING ACADEMIC CREDITS, IN

PARTNERSHIP WITH PROGRAMS
LIKE THE WASHINGTON CENTER.

THE LIFE OF A CAPITOL HILL
INTERN IS NOT ALWAYS
GLAMOROUS. BUT IT DOES
GIVE THESE YOUNG MEN AND
WOMEN AN UNRIVALED VIEW OF
AMERICAN DEMOCRACY AT
WORK. AND I THINK THAT

EXPERIENCE CAN PAY

IMPORTANT DIVIDENDS DOWN

THE ROAD —— FOR ALL OF US.

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, WE CAN ALL AGREE THAT WE NEED TO ATTRACT 'GOOD' PEOPLE TO GOVERNMENT SERVICE. BUT WE ALSO KNOW THAT THE

GOVERNMENT, OR THE EDUCATION SECTOR FOR THAT MATTER, CAN'T ALWAYS COMPETE FINANCIALLY WITH THE PRIVATE SECTOR. SOME OF US ARE TRYING TO CHANGE THAT, BUT I DON'T THINK THE DAY IS NEAR WHEN GOVERNMENT SALARIES WILL REACH A LEVEL COMPARABLE TO BUSINESS.

NOR DO I THINK, BY THE WAY, THAT WE SHOULD CONSIDER LIMITING THE TERMS OF THOSE WHO WISH TO SERVE. SO IT WILL ALWAYS BE SOMETHING SPECIAL THAT DRAWS PEOPLE INTO GOVERNMENT. FOR MANY PEOPLE, IT'S A DEDICATION TO PUBLIC SERVICE. AND THAT'S

WHERE THE INTERN PROGRAM COMES IN -- IT'S THE EXPOSURE TO PUBLIC SERVICE THAT MANY YOUNG PEOPLE GET THROUGH PROGRAMS SUCH AS THE WASHINGTON CENTER THAT IS SO CRITICAL TO DEVELOPING THAT THIRST FOR PUBLIC SERVICE THAT DRAWS QUALITY PEOPLE INTO THE GOVERNMENT.

I'M PLEASED TO SAY THAT I HAVE PERSONALLY BENEFITED FROM THIS FINE PROGRAM --ASIDE FROM NUMEROUS INTERNS, TWO WASHINGTON CENTER ALUMNI, DAVID WILSON AND SARAH BROWN, HAVE BROUGHT THEIR EXPERIENCES IN THE PROGRAM TO WORK FULL-TIME ON MY SENATE STAFF.

MANY PEOPLE HAVE INSPIRED ME IN MY LIFE. BUT PERHAPS THE MOST INFLUENTIAL POLITICALLY WAS BETH BOWERS, THE LAW LIBRARIAN AT WASHBURN UNIVERSITY -- AND A DEMOCRAT TO BOOT. MISS BOWERS ENCOURAGED MY CLASSMATES AND ME TO TAKE

AN ACTIVE INTERTEST IN POLITICS. SHE EXPLAINED THAT HAVING JUST FOUGHT A WAR -- WORLD WAR 2 --FOR THE SURVIVAL OF DEMOCRACY, WE MIGHT PRESUME TO HOLD A FRANCHISE ON THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS. WHEN MISS BOWERS SUGGESTED I RUN FOR THE KANSAS STATE

LEGISLATURE IN THE FALL OF 1950, I LISTENED —— AND ACTED. I ALSO SAW PUBLIC SERVICE AS A WAY TO GIVE BACK A LITTLE OF WHAT HAD BEEN SHOWERED ON ME BY A GENEROUS COMMUNITY EAGER TO HELP ME RECOVER FROM MY WAR WOUNDS.

SO, PUBLIC SERVICE HAS

MANY DIFFERENT LURES, AND IT'S CERTAINLY IN OUR INTEREST TO EXPOSE STUDENTS TO THE GOVERNMENTAL PROCESS. PROGRAMS LIKE THE WASHINGTON CENTER MAKE US ALL WINNERS -- BE IT THE SENATOR, THE STUDENT, OR SOCIETY AT LARGE. THANK YOU.

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
