SUBJ: NRCC KEYNOTE SPEECH TODAY

The Senator, as you know, is scheduled to keynote the luncheon today for the National Republican Congressional Committee. Speech is scheduled for anytime between 12:00 and 1:15.

Since we still don't know when the Senator will be able to get away for this, I have made arrangements with NRCC for him to be put on the program immediately on his arrival -- whenever that may be.

They will serve lunch promptly at 12:00 noon. Lisa Hogan will wait for him at the Terrace on the lower level (T Street side, not Connecticut Avenue) of the Washington Hilton Hotel. She will then escort the Senator to the main ballroom, site of the event, and they can commence the program whenever he wishes.

Senator will be introduced by Ed Prince, Chairman of the Board of the Prince Corporation, from Michigan -- he is the National Chairman of the Republican Congressional Leadership Council (the group Senator Dole is addressing).

Format is a free-standing podium with mike (NO head table). In addition to Congressman Guy VanderJagt (Chairman of NRCC), in attendance are 300 members who have contributed between \$2,500 and \$5,000 to the NRCC per year. These are <u>individual</u> contributors, not PAC representatives, and represent a cross-section of the entire country.

Other speakers today have been Newt Gingrich, Guy VanderJagt, Bob Mosbacher, and FDIC Chairman William Seidman.

They ask that the Senator's comments focus on the general importance of making Republican gains in the Congress, with emphasis on redistricting which will have a major impact in 1990 and 1992 on the makeup of the Congress.

He may also talk about Senate races, and how the House has been such a wonderful "training ground" for Senate candidates. (This should be said half in jest.)

His thoughts on what can be expected legislatively from the Congress for the rest of the year would also be welcome, as would his remarks on Eastern Europe and the MidEast.

FLORIDA WHERE THE MOST OPEN SEATS WILL BE CREATED. SO I HOPE THAT IF YOU LIVE IN THOSE AREAS, YOU'LL ALSO BE ACTIVE IN THE GOVERNORS RACES, BECAUSE THEIR IMPACT WILL BE FELT HERE FOR AT LEAST THE NEXT DECADE.

PRESIDENT DESERVES A MAJORITY

I KNOW WE CAN ALL AGREE THAT PRESIDENT BUSH DESERVES A MAJORITY IN CONGRESS — — AND THE DEMOCRATS ARE A MAJOR REASON WHY, BECAUSE THEY ARE FIGHTING HIM EVERY STEP OF THE WAY.

WE'VE PREVAILED IN THE SENATE ON VETOES, BUT ONLY BY A RAZOR'S EDGE. IT ALL GOES TO SHOW THAT THERE'S NO SUBSTITUTE FOR A GENUINE MAJORITY.

THE DEMOCRATS ALSO CAN'T HIDE FROM THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE NO AGENDA. SOME DEMOCRATS THIS YEAR HAVE

TRIED TO SELL SOME 'NEW THINKING' THIS YEAR. BUT ABOUT ALL WE'VE SEEN IS 'OLD LIBERAL THINKING.'

JUST LOOK AT THOSE LINING UP TO CASH IN ON THE SO— CALLED PEACE DIVIDEND. PERHAPS SOME DAY WE WILL HAVE SOME REAL DEFENSE

SAVINGS WE CAN SPEND FOR WORTHY PROGRAMS, BUT I CAN'T BE TOO ANXIOUS TO GUT DEFENSE WHEN WE DON'T KNOW WHAT THE SOVIETS ARE GOING TO DO IN LITHUANIA -- OR IF GORBACHEV IS EVEN GOING TO SURVIVE. I DON'T THINK WE SHOULD RULE OUT THAT THIS MAN WHOM WE

HAVE STAKED SO MUCH OF OUR FUTURE ON COULD CONSOLIDATE HIS POWER, OR BE OUSTED —— IT'S A REAL POSSIBILITY.

AND THEN THERE WAS CONGRESSMAN GEPHARDT'S PLAN, WHICH NOT EVEN MANY IN HIS OWN PARTY ENDORSED,

TO SEND DIRECT FOOD AID TO THE SOVIET UNION. IF YOU ASK ME, NOW IS NOT THE TIME TO BE WRITING OUT CHECKS TO GORBACHEV WHILE HE CONTIUES TO POUR BILLIONS OF DOLLARS INTO ANACHRONISTIC REGIMES IN CUBA AND AFGHANISTAN. IF HE NEEDS READY CASH, HE SHOULD GET A REFUND FROM

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CASTRO, NOT FROM UNCLE SAM.

SUCCESS OF THE REPUBLICAN MESSAGE

MEANWHILE, OUR REPUBLICAN MESSAGE OF HOPE, PEACE AND PROSPERITY CONTINUES TO PICK UP STEAM HERE AT HOME AND

BLOC AND IN THE WORLD ARE FUNDAMENTAL AND ARE NOT GOING TO BE REFVERSED.

BUT OUR JOB IS NOT DONE. WE CAN'T GIVE UP NOW.

NO ONE IS MORE PREPARED TO MANAGE AFFAIRS IN THIS NEW WORLD THAN THE

REPUBLICAN PARTY.

BUT TO DO THAT, WE NEED TO ELECT AS MANY REPUBLICAN AS WE CAN. WE HAVE TO WORK HARD, WORK TOGETHER, AND THEN WORK SOME MORE.
