# THANK YOU AND GOOD MORNING. IT'S ALWAYS A PLEASURE TO CHAT WITH SOME OF OUR NATION'S OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. YOUR ENROLLMENT IN THIS PROGRAM

DEMONSTRATES A SPECIAL COMMITMENT TO LEARNING ABOUT OUR GOVERNMENT, ITS INSTITUTIONS, AND ITS ROLE IN SOCIETY. YOUR INTEREST IN GOVERNMENT WILL NOT ONLY SERVE YOU WELL, BUT WILL ALSO BENEFIT OUR COUNTRY -- BECAUSE OUT OF YOUR GENERATION WILL COME OUR

LEADERS OF TOMORROW.

# EXCITING TIMES; CHANGES IN SOVIET UNION, EASTERN EUROPE

LET ME TALK FOR A MOMENT ABOUT OUR WORLD, BECAUSE IT CERTAINLY IS AN EXCITING TIME TO BE AN OBSERVER OF HISTORY —— AND IT'S A

SUBJECT THAT HAS CAPTIVATED US HERE IN CONGESS. NONE OF US A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO COULD HAVE IMAGINED HOW DIFFERENT THE WORLD WOULD BE BY THE TIME YOU GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL -- THE CHANGES HAVE BEEN NOTHING SHORT OF BREATHTAKING. AND IN MY

OPINION, THE CHANGES IN THE SOVIET UNION, IN THE COMMUNIST BLOC AND IN THE WORLD ARE FUNDAMENTAL CHANGES. THEY ARE NOT GOING TO BE REVERSED. IN MY OWN VIEW --STARING COMMUNISM'S FAILURE IN THE FACE, GORBACHEV TOOK A GAMBLE. BY LAUNCHING

POLICIES WE NOW CODE WORD 'GLASTNOST' AND 'PERESTROIKA,' HE GAMBLED THAT A LITTLE FREEDOM -- POLITICAL, SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC --COULD SOMEHOW REVITALIZE A SPENT SYSTEM. THE GAMBLE DIDN'T WORK. THAT 'LITTLE FREEDOM' TURNED OUT TO BE THE SPARK WHICH

IGNITED AN EXPLOSION OF PENT-UP ANGER AND FRUSTRATION -- BOTH INSIDE THE SOVIET UNION AND THE COMMUNIST BLOC. I BELIEVE THE CHANGES HAVE BEEN MORE FAR-REACHING AND RAPID THAN GORBACHEV, HIMSELF, ENVISIONED.

THE GENIE IS CLEARLY OUT OF

THE BOTTLE.

**GORBACHEV'S CHALLENGES** DURING THE SUMMIT A FEW WEEKS AGO, I HAD THE **OPPORTUNITY TO MEET** GORBACHEV THREE TIMES. HE CAME TO THIS SUMMIT IN A MUCH WEAKER POSITION THAN HE WAS AT THE LAST WASHINGTON SUMMIT JUST TWO

AND A HALF YEARS BEFORE. AND FROM OUR MEETINGS. ESPECIALLY A LENGTHY SESSION WITH CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS, IT WAS CLEAR THAT GORBACHEV HAS SOME REALLY TOUGH DAYS AHEAD OF HIM. IT'S EASY TO OVERLOOK THE FACT THAT GORBACHEV IS MUCH MORE POPULAR IN

### AMERICA THAN HE IS IN HIS OWN COUNTRY.

HIS ECONOMIC REFORMS ARE ALREADY CREATING PUBLIC DISSATISFACTION. HE FACES AN UNPRECEDENTED POLITICAL CHALLENGE FROM BORIS YELTSIN. AND OF COURSE, THE FREEDOM MOVEMENT IN THE BALTIC STATES SIMPLY IS NOT

GOING TO GO AWAY. AS FAR AS WE IN CONGRESS ARE CONCERNED, HE NEEDS TO MAKE GENUINE PROGRESS TOWARDS GRANTING FREEDOM TO THE BALTICS, AND IN THE AREA OF EMIGRATION, BEFORE WE APPROVE THE TRADE AGREEMENT THAT HE SO BADLY WANTS AND NEEDS.

WITH ALL THESE CHALLENGES FACING GORBACHEV AND THE SOVIET UNION, WE CAN'T PRECLUDE ANY OUTCOME INSIDE THE KREMLIN --- FROM GORBACHEV'S CONTINUED CONSOLIDATION OF PERSONAL AUTHORITY, TO HIS OUSTER. AND I WOULDN'T ENTIRELY WRITE OFF THE POSSIBILITY THAT HIS OUSTER COULD LEAD TO A REAL CRACKDOWN INSIDE THE SOVIET UNION.

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, THESE CHANGES HAVE BEEN HISTORIC. BUT THE LAST CHAPTER HAS NOT YET BEEN WRITTEN, AND IT WILL CREATE EXCITING CHALLENGES FOR US IN This document is from the collections at the Dole Archives, University of Kansas http://dolearchives.ku.edu

#### CHALLENGE OF THE DEFICIT

WE ALSO HAVE TREMENDOUS CHALLENGES HERE AT HOME, NOT THE LEAST OF WHICH IS OUR MASSIVE FEDERAL DEFICIT. I STRONGLY BELIVE THAT WE IN

CONGRESS OWE IT TO YOUR GENERATION TO GET THOSE DEFICITS DOWN, SO YOU CAN ENJOY AS BRIGHT A FUTURE AS WE HAVE HAD.

### THE BUDGET PROCESS

AS YOU MAY HAVE HEARD, THE CONGRESS AND THE ADMINISTRATION ARE IN THE MIDDLE OF HEAVY DUTY

NEGOTIATIONS ON THE BUDGET AND DEFICIT REDUCTION. TO BE HONEST, I DON'T THINK WE HAVE MADE A LOT OF PROGRESS SO FAR. EVERYONE IN THE ROOM -- DEMOCRAT AND REPUBLICAN --- REALIZES THAT WE HAVE A BIG PROBLEM, BUT NO ONE IS WILLING TO PUT ANYTHING SIGNIFICANT ON THE

TABLE. AT LEAST, NOT YET. THAT'S TOO BAD, BECAUSE THE DEFICIT IS TRULY OUR COUNTRY'S 'PUBLIC ENEMY NUMBER ONE'. IN 1991, WE WILL NEED AT LEAST \$50 BILLION DOLLARS IN DEFICIT REDUCTION TO MEET OUR GRAMM-RUDMAN TARGET -- AND THAT'S AFTER TAKING THE SAVINGS AND

LOAN BAILOUT OFF BUDGET. EVEN FOR A BLOATED AND WASTEFUL CONGRESS, \$50 BILLION IS NOT PEANUTS. LAST YEAR, FOR EXAMPLE, WE SPENT 10 MONTHS AND DEVOTED OVER 60% OF OUR ROLL CALL VOTES IN THE SENATE TO REDUCE THE DEFICIT BY ONLY \$16 BILLION. AND WE NEEDED FOUR MONTHS

OF AUTOMATIC, ACROSS-THE-BOARD, GRAMM-RUDMAN CUTS JUST TO DO THAT.

MEANWHILE, INTEREST ON OUR NATIONAL DEBT IS APPROACHING \$200 BILLION A YEAR, TWICE AS MUCH AS THE ENTIRE FEDERAL BUDGET WHEN I WAS FIRST ELECTED TO CONGRESS. SOMETIME IN JULY,

WE WILL HAVE TO PASS A BILL TO INCREASE THE DEBT LIMIT AGAIN —— TO SOMETHING WELL OVER \$3 TRILLION DOLLARS —— THAT'S TRILLION WITH A T.

I AM NOT SAYING THE ISSUES WE FACE IN THE SUMMIT ARE EASY. WE HAVE TO MAKE TOUGH CHOICES ON THE SOCIAL SECURITY TRUST FUND, CONTROLLING THE COST OF HEALTH CARE FOR THE ELDERLY, HELPING NEW DEMOCRACIES IN EUROPE AND LATIN AMERICA, NEW TAXES AND THE S&L CRISIS. IT'S UGLY, BUT FROM THE WAY I LOOK AT IT, IT IS NOT GOING TO GET ANY EASIER IF WE CONTINUE TO PUT

EVERYTHING OFF.

THE BOTTOM LINE IS THAT IF WE DON'T DO OUR JOB, YOU WILL BE THE ONES TO SUFFER. YOU WILL HAVE LESS OPPORTUNITY AND MORE **RESPONSIBILITY IF THOSE OF US** WHO ARE HERE IN CONGRESS DO NOT FULFILL OUR **RESPONSIBILITIES IN ACTING ON** 

# THE BUDGET AND THE BUDGET DEFICIT. I CAN ASSURE YOU THAT'S NOT A LEGACY I WANT TO LEAVE BEHIND.

I AM OFTEN ASKED HOW I GOT INVOLVED IN POLITICS. MANY PEOPLE HAVE INSPIRED ME IN MY LIFE. BUT PERHAPS THE MOST INFLUENTIAL POLITICALLY WAS BETH BOWERS,

THE LAW LIBRARIAN AT WASHBURN UNIVERSITY -- AND A DEMOCRAT TO BOOT. MISS BOWERS ENCOURAGED MY CLASSMATES AND ME TO TAKE AN ACTIVE INTEREST IN POLITICS. SHE EXPLAINED THAT HAVING JUST FOUGHT A WAR -- WORLD WAR 2 --FOR THE SURVIVAL OF

DEMOCRACY, WE MIGHT PRESUME TO HOLD A FRANCHISE ON THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS. WHEN MISS BOWERS SUGGESTED I RUN FOR THE KANSAS STATE LEGISLATURE IN THE FALL OF 1950, I LISTENED -- AND ACTED. I ALSO SAW PUBLIC SERVICE AS A WAY TO GIVE BACK A LITTLE OF WHAT HAD

BEEN SHOWERED ON ME BY A GENEROUS COMMUNITY EAGER TO HELP ME RECOVER FROM MY WAR WOUNDS.

THAT'S HOW I GOT HERE, BUT EVERY MEMBER OF CONGRESS HAS A DIFFERENT STORY. GOVERNMENT CAN BE EXCITING, BUT IT CAN ALSO BE FRUSTRATING. BUT ONE THING
