 Father of three children; Carlton, Pamela and Shelley.




Tom Davis: A Leader For The Future.

- Transportation. Tom Davis is committed to finishing the Fairfax County Parkway with voterapproved funding.

Take a look around Fairfax County.





A BIOGRAPHY

Tom Davis moved with his family to Northern Virginia at the age of 4 in 1953. He was educated in our public school system and served as a U.S. Senate page graduating from the Capitol Page School in 1967. He continued his education at Amherst College graduating cum laude with a degree in political science.

Upon graduation Tom served in the army and then joined the National Guard as an infantry officer receiving an honorable discharge with the rank of 1st Lieutenant. He then enrolled in and received his law degree from the University of Virginia.

Since then Tom has led a very active professional and civic career. The many positions he has held include: Chairman of the State Legal Services Advisory Board, President of his Homeowners Association, President of the Bailey's Crossroads Rotary Club and a member of Secretary Jack Kemp's Transition Team at the Department of Housing and Urban Development. He also currently serves as a corporate officer and General Counsel with PRC, Inc., in McLean, Virginia.

A lifelong Republican, Tom ia a current member of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors representing the Mason district. First elected in 1979 with 63% of the vote, he has subsequently been reelected in 1983 and 1987 with 77% and 83% of the vote respectively.

Tom is married to the former Peggy Rantz; a graduate of J.E.B. Stuart High School, Bryn Mawr College, and the University of Virginia's Medical School.
