

GOVERNMENT: THAT'S NOT,
REPEAT, NOT THE MESSAGE
AMERICANS ARE SENDING ITS
ELECTED OFFICIALS.

SO, IF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE ARE TO BELIEVE ALL THE RHETORIC, AND ALL THE SPEECHES THEY'VE BEEN HEARING ABOUT THE ECONOMY, AND HEALTH CARE, AND ALL THE OTHER CHALLENGES FACING US THIS YEAR, THEN WE IN CONGRESS, IN BOTH PARTIES, BETTER START DELIVERING INSTEAD OF JUST COMPLAIN

OR PROMISING.

IN CONCLUSION, I WOULD JUST LIKE TO SAY THANK YOU" TO EVERY KANSAN WHO TOOK THE TIME TO WRITE OR CALL ME, TO WISH ME WELL DURING MY RECENT HOSPITALIZATION, AND THROUGHOUT MY CONTINUING RECOVERY. I CAN NOT ADEQUATELY

DESCRIBE WHAT THAT
OUTPOURING MEANT TO ME AND
ELIZABETH. I WILL NEVER
