

*I LIKE TO CALL THIS BILL

"THE PLANT CLOSING ACT,"

BECAUSE THE BOTTOM LINE OF

THIS BILL IS THAT IT WILL MEAN

MORE STRIKES AND ANTI
COMPETITIVE COLLECTIVE

BARGAINING AGREEMENTS.

THANKS, IN LARGE PARTS, TO YOUR EFFORTS.

*THIS DOESN'T GIVE YOU A REASON TO LET UP HOWEVER. I CAN'T REPEAT ENOUGH THAT IT IS THE WORK OF THE **ASSOCIATED SPECIALTY CONTRACTORS AND OTHER** ORGANIZATIONS THAT HELPS TO BRING A SANITY CHECK ON A

LOT OF BAD IDEAS FLOATING
AROUND THE HILL.

*BEFORE I CONCLUDE, I DO
WANT TO TALK A LITTLE
POLITICS. IF THERE'S ONE
WORD THAT SEEMS TO BE
