Dear Colleague:

The increase in funding for cancer research at the National Cancer Institute (NCI) was one of our major accomplishments in health care last year. Important strides were made in focusing attention on the terrible toll that breast, prostate, and other reproductive system cancers are taking on American families. The increase in fiscal year 1992 funding for the NCI provided \$40 million additional funding for breast cancer research, doubled the amount of funding for prostate cancer research, and significantly enhanced support for ovarian and cervical cancers. But even more is needed. Cancer rates are growing. Now one in three Americans will be struck by cancer during their lifetime.
