Commencement Speaker Senator Bob Dole

Senator Bob Dole, one of America's most respected and best known leaders, has a distinguished record of public service that spans almost four decades. Respected as a master legislator, Dole was unanimously reelected by his Republican colleagues to a third term as their Senate leader in November of 1988.

A tough, common sense conservative from America's heartland, Dole has earned national acclaim for his leadership on issues including budget responsibility, tax reform, a sound Social Security system, quality and affordable health care, rights for the disadvantaged and persons with disabilities, and for a better future for rural America.

Dole entered public office for the first time when he was elected to the Kansas House of Representatives at the age of 26. Two years later he became Russell County's prosecuting attorney, an office he held until his 1960 election to Congress.

Dole later became Republican national chairman and President Gerald Ford's running mate in the 1976 presidential election. In the past two senate elections in Kansas - 1980 and 1986 - Bob Dole won every one of the state's 105 counties.

Dole was first elected to the United States Senate in 1968, after serving four consecutive terms in the House of Representatives. From 1981-84, he was Chairman oif the powerful Senate Finance Committee, where he was instrumental with President Reagan in laying the foundation for America's strongest economic recovery in 30 years.

Pratt Community College welcomes Senator Dole and is proud to have him as our guest.

Outstanding Alumnus Award Recipient Clarence J. Beck

Clarence James Beck was a member of Pratt Community College's first graduating class of 1940. He went on to Kansas University, graduating in 1943 with a degree in Metallurgic Engineering.

While in Pratt, he met and married his wife, Hazel, who was working as the superintendent of the Ninnescah Hospital. The Becks have one child, Dr. Linda K. Beck.

Beck spent 27 years of his successful career working for General Electric at the Knoll's Atomic Power Laboratory (KAPL) in Schenectady, New York. While at KAPL several inventions were patented and technical papers published. Beck was involved in the design and management of nuclear propulsion submarines and worked closely with Admiral Hyman Rickover. Following his first "retirement" from Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory, he accepted a position with Combustion Engineering, Inc., as an executive assistant to the general manager. This position involved coordination of specifications and quality control for production of nuclear parts by major steel companies in the United States and Europe.

Throughout his illustrious career, he has maintained close, personal ties with Pratt Community College and the University of Kansas.

Clarence Beck built an outstanding career, credits much of his first success to his first college, and has never forgotten the value of his community college education. He is an outstanding example of an individual who recognized the value of an education, took advantage of the opportunites before him and capitalized on his talents. Pratt Community College and the PCC Alumni Association are honored to recognize Clarence Beck as the 1992 Outstanding Alumnus of the Year.

PRATT'S NEW AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

PRATT IS ON THE VERGE OF STARTING AN AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM, BUT NEEDS FAA CERTIFICATION. FAA'S REVIEW HAS BEEN PENDING SINCE FEBRUARY BECAUSE A GREEN PRINCIPAL INVESTIGATOR EITHER GAVE THE SCHOOL LOW PRIORITY OR WAS SIMPLY OVERWHELMED WITH HIS NEW RESPONSIBILITIES.

FAA CERTIFICATION IS NECESSARY TO ENROLL STUDENTS FOR THE FALL PROGRAM. FURTHERMORE, THE LACK OF CERTIFICATION COULD JEOPARDIZE PRATT'S 3-YEAR \$300,000 U.S. DEPT. OF ED. TITLE III GRANT. YOU WROTE A SUPPORT LETTER TO SEC. ALEXANDER REGARDING THIS GRANT.

I SPOKE TO GREG S. ABOUT RESOLVING THIS ISSUE. GREG TALKED TO THE FAA AND WAS ASSURED THAT THEY WILL BE IN PRATT ON FRIDAY (MAY 15TH) TO DETERMINE IF THE SCHOOL HAS THE CORRECT EQUIPMENT. IF SO, IT IS OUR UNDERSTANDING THAT EVERYTHING IS A GO.

PERKINS AND TECH-PREP PROGRAM

PRATT HAS UNDERTAKEN AN AMBITIOUS 8 SERVICE SITE (HIGH SCHOOLS) TECH-PREP PROJECT, AND HOPES TO EXPAND INSTRUCTION THROUGH INTERACTIVE

CABLE. THE TECH-PREP CONCEPT IS NEW AND WAS INCLUDED IN THE 1990 REAUTHORIZATION OF THE CARL PERKINS VOC/ED ACT (YOU SUPPORTED IT). THESE PROGRAMS SMOOTH THE TRANSITION BETWEEN SCHOOL AND THE WORK PLACE BY ENABLING LABOR-ORIENTED HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO TAKE TWO-YEARS OF ACADEMIC EDUCATION AND TWO-YEARS OF VOCATIONAL EDUCATION.

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CC'S AND JUCO'S

A FOUR TRILLION DOLLAR NATIONAL DEBT, FOR INSTANCE. AND A FEELING AMONG AMERICANS THAT FOREIGN AID IS A WASTE OF MONEY, AT A TIME WHEN THE EMERGING DEMOCRACIES NEED OUR HELP IF THEY ARE TO SURVIVE. WE ALSO HAVE THE MOST ADVANCED HEALTH CARE

FACILITIES IN THE WORLD, YET

A BALANCE BETWEEN THE
