*GOOD MORNING. AS YOU KNOW, WE HAVE THESE AWARD ASSEMBLIES TO RECOGNIZE YOUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS. EACH ONE OF YOU PROBABLY DESERVES AN MEDAL JUST FOR PUTTING UP WITH US FOR THE

LAST SIX MONTHS. AND I KNOW THAT A FEW TROOPERS HAVE BEEN HERE EVEN LONGER --LIKE JILL PAGE.

*DURING YOUR TIME IN THE SENATE, YOU HAVE MADE MANY FRIENDS. WITHOUT OUT A DOUBT, YOU HAVE MET MORE WORLD LEADERS THAN YOUR FRIENDS BACK HOME, AND PERHAPS THE PRESIDENT.

MEETING YELTSIN, GORBACHEV, GERMAN PRESIDENT VON WEIZSACKER, AND PRESIDENT BUSH WILL BE MEMORIES THAT YOU CAN KEEP FOREVER.

*I TRUST THAT YOU WILL REMEMBER MORE THAN JUST WHO YOU HAVE MET, BUT ALSO WHAT YOU HAVE DONE. WHILE WE MAY NOT HAVE ALWAYS

SHOWN IT, AND I THINK THAT I CAN SPEAK FOR MY COLLEAGUES, WE DID APPRECIATE ALL YOUR HARD WORK. WITHOUT YOU, THE CHAMBER WOULD BE CHAOTIC. INSTEAD,

***AND SPEAKING OF CHAOS, I** WAS PLEASED TO HEAR THAT **ONE OF YOU RETURNED THE** HOUSE CLOCK AFTER YELTSIN'S SPEECH. THE HOUSE HAS ENOUGH PROBLEMS BALANCING **ITS CHECK BOOKS, WITHOUT** WONDERING WHAT TIME IT IS. ***IN CLOSING, I MIGHT ADD** THAT YOUR GENERATION IS ON THE VERGE OF A BRIGHT

FUTURE. BUT THAT FUTURE ALSO PRESENTS CHALLENGES. ONE OF THE MOST PRESSING **ISSUES IS THE DEFICIT, AND YOU** WILL MOST LIKELY GET STRAPPED WITH THIS BURDEN. YOUR GRANDPARENTS AND PARENTS WON'T BE PAYING FOR IT AND YOUR GENERATION DOESN'T HAVE ANY LOBBYISTS WORKING FOR THEM.
