SUBJECT: TOPEKA BREAKFAST MEETING -- ISSUES

PIAGGIO

Duane Faust, VP/GM of Piaggio in Wichita met with Topeka officials regarding their interest in landing the Piaggio production facility. Duane met with Emry Fager, Topeka Chamber officials, and members of the airport authority.

The status of the Piaggio move is as follows:

- The Army/National Guard has received the funds from OSD to purchase the aircraft, however, the program manager is reluctant to buy the planes because of the language Exon put in the bill requiring a study.
- You have weighed in with General Conoway, Chief of the National Guard. Conoway supports buying the Piaggio for his modernization needs.
- You have written Cheney asking that he complete the study ASAP so that the funds can be obligated.
- Piaggio looks to make a decision in the Spring.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TEAM

I have considered organizing an economic development team within your staff. This would include Kathy, Greg, Diana Dooms, Marcie, and myself. The purpose would be to work with the various Chambers and communities to work development issues with them, ie. highway projects, grants, special appropriations, projects, etc. We would meet formally with the groups, share information, and keep in touch with what they are doing. In addition, we would disseminate information regarding relevant programs, legislation, and grant applications. The point is, if the staff understands what the communities are working toward, we will be better prepared to help them help themselves.

We do these things now, but it is not structured and works on an ad hoc basis. Should you support this concept, you may want to talk about it at the meeting.

ANDY CHANDLER

Andy will likely bring up the Yamamoto issue on behalf of George. The status is as follows:

- At your request, the Air Force formally reviewed the case. The board was split as to whether to award the "Victory" to Rex Barber or to just leave things as they are. The board punted to Air Force Secretary Rice. I talked to Rice today. He said he would make the decision his watch (prior Jan 20). He has not reviewed the details of the case so he wouldn't indicate his view, but he understands your interest.
- Andy is a strong supporter of the military in Kansas, especially the Guard. You were very helpful in getting Kansas a new communications system, a state-of-the-art fire arms training system (to be placed at Nickell Barracks, Salina), and the 4 UH-60 Blackhawk helicopters. You wrote General Conoway a letter telling him to make sure this equipment ends up where it is supposed to, Kansas.

GENERAL NATIONAL GUARD ISSUES

- There may be some questions regarding what will happen with the Guard reorganization and what Clinton is likely to do. Clinton has made noises about relying more heavily on the Guard, but who can say at this point.
- Should additional cuts come, we will get our share, but things should remain pretty solid. I know of no plans that would bring Forbes any new Guard assets, though.
- Forbes will remain the site of debarcation for the 1st Division. They need some military construction work there, however, and we will put these projects in the hopper for the '94 defense bill.
- The usual infighting in the Kansas Guard seems to becoming to a head with the Adjutant General, Jim Reuger on the receiving end. I'm not sure what the problem is this time,
