

AMA Announces Ten Nathan Davis Award Winners Senators Dole and Bumpers Cited for Public Health Work

Washington, D.C. The American Medical Association released today the names of ten government leaders who have been selected by an independent panel of judges as recipients of the 1992 Dr. Nathan Davis Awards. The Awards, named for the founder of the AMA, recognize excellence in public service in the health field at the federal, state and local level of government.

The 1992 winners are: Senators Dale Bumpers (D., Ark.) and Bob Dole (R., Kan.), Congressman Charles B. Rangel (D., N.Y.), Surgeon General Antonia C. Novello, Dr. Anthony Fauci (NIH), State Senator John Kitzhaber (Oregon), State Senator Tarki Lombardi, Jr. (N.Y.), Mayor Haden McKay (Humble, Texas) and community health leaders Dr. Carol Brumback (Palm Beach County, Fla.) and Florence Reeves, B.S.N., (Tacoma, Washington). All of the recipients will be honored at the Awards Banquet set for Tuesday, February 2, 1993 in Washington, D.C.

Judges for the Dr. Nathan Davis Awards, reflecting a cross-section of government, public health and education expertise, included former Congressmen Bill Frenzel and Paul Rogers, Dr. William Maxted, Academic Dean, Georgetown University School of Medicine and Dr. Arnold Reiman, Editor in Chief Emeritus, New England Journal of Medicine, Kenneth Melley, Senior Executive with the National Education Association, Lois Haight Herrington, former Assistant U.S. Attorney General and Jane Sloat, Washington D.C. Civic Leader. Nominations for award winners in all categories were reviewed by the judges during the summer, 1992.


