Senator Dole --

For your appearance at the United Jewish Appeal luncheon tomorrow in SDG-50.

This is basically a drop-by. They asked for a few remarks on current events and will want to ask a few questions.

There is nothing new on the Middle East since your last meetings with Jewish groups. Secretary Christopher will meet with Senators in a closed session at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday to talk about his trip and the peace process.

There is a third air drop scheduled for Bosnia Tuesday night. We have initial reports of misses from the ham radio operators but their information has not been always reliable in the past. The Aspin/Powell briefing indicated we are getting some supplies to those who need them.

The most important direct or indirect effect of the drops seems to be that the Serbs have now allowed all the waiting ground convoys to go through. This is ultimately the best way to handle food aid.
