VIOLATED THE DIRECT INSTRUCTIONS OF OUR FRIEND. AND YOU CAN REST ASSURED THAT THE ENVELOPE I PLACED IN THE CASKET CONTAINED MY PERSONAL CHECK FOR THE FULL \$50,000." ***ALL THIS BY WAY OF SAYING** THAT IF THE CLINTON ECONOMIC PLAN TAKES AFFECT,
