THE PROGRAM

Learn a sport for life!

You'll learn to enjoy either recreational sailing or racing!

Open to all Wichita area kids!

The program is available to all Wichita area kids, 8 to 17 years old. No membership fees are required. RiverKids is Wichita's Community Sailing Program.

RiverKids Sail Club was established on the simple premise that no kid will ever look at the world quite the same after they have, by their own wits, figured how to use the wind to move their boat through the water. Last summer more than 100 youths ages 8 to 17 learned how to do exactly that, sailing in downtown Wichita on the Arkansas River.

THE APPROACH

Learning to sail is FUN!

With the wind in your hair and helm in your hand, you'll learn to move the boat wherever you want it to go!

The program is safe!

It is taught under the auspices of the City of Wichita Department of Parks and Recreation. All instructors are either mature adult volunteers who are seasoned sailors or they are U.S. Sailing Certified Instructors.

All participants are required to complete the City of Wichita Department of Parks and Recreation Participation Form. This is mailed to you upon receipt of your preregistration form included in this brochure. Participants must know how to swim.

1993 SUMMER SCHEDULE

Two courses are offered, designed to meet the requirements of all families.

Introduction to Sailing

Meets Monday, Tuesday and Thursday:
Enroll in one of these three sessions:
Mornings, 9 a.m. - 12 noon
Afternoons, 1 - 4 p.m.
Evenings, 5 - 8 p.m.

This course is taught by experienced volunteers and teaches the basics of sailing in an accelerated fashion. Total of 9 hours.

Intermediate Sailing

Sail every weekday morning from 9:00 a.m. till 12 noon for three weeks! Lessons cover boathandling, sail-trim, the sailing environment, racing rules, games, safety, history of the sport and much more. This is a rigorous but enjoyable introduction to the sport. 30 hours total.

Upon completion, you will be certified as an "Able Sailor" and be able to rent boats or participate in RiverKids Sail Club Regattas!

THE AMERICA'S CUP WINNER FROM WICHITA

When Bill Koch — our club's 1992 Man of the Year — was a young man growing up in Kansas, winning an America's Cup was the furthest thing from his mind. But, while attending Culver Military Academy one summer, he learned to sail. That experience initiated a life-long love of the sport, culminating with his winning the world's most

prestigious yachting prize in 1992.

Not every young person will win the America's Cup. But Bill Koch firmly believes that the valuable lessons learned in a youth sailing program remain with a person for life.



That's why he is promoting youth sailing as one of the specific missions of the America's Foundation.

Learning to sail, says Bill Koch, combines mental and physical challenges. It encourages physical fitness, self-reliance, persistence and decision-making. "Learning to harness these natural laws of physics gives a young person self-confidence and a new perspective of the world," he notes.

Bill Koch certainly benefitted from those lessons. They helped him found several major corporations, twice win the maxi-boat world championships, and climb to the pinnacle of America's Cup action on his first try.

Participating in youth sailing may yet inspire others to achieve lofty goals and conquer great challenges. Bill Koch believes so. That's why he is supporting the RiverKids Sailing program, and has become a leading proponent of the new Downtown Boathouse.

Sailing has a bright future in Kansas. And who knows but what the RiverKids Sail Club might one day turn out another Kansan who wins an America's Cup!

BUTLER COUNTY COMMUNITY

NATION, MORE THAN SIX
MILLION MEN AND WOMEN
RANGING IN AGE FROM 18 TO 80**

**ARE NOW ENROLLED IN JUNIOR
AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES.**

BECOME A LAWYER. AND IT
WAS WHILE AT LAW SCHOOL,
THAT THE LAW LIBRARIAN
URGED ME TO RUN FOR PUBLIC
OFFICE.**

IN PUBLIC SERVICE GOT
STARTED. I SUSPECT THERE
ARE A FEW PEOPLE IN KANSAS--
AND IN THE WHITE HOUSE--WHO

WIDE OPEN FOR YOU.**

**WHATEVER CHOICE YOU
MAKE, IT'S LIKELY THAT
SOMETIME IN YOUR LIFE,
THINGS WON'T GO EXACTLY AS
PLANNED...A DOOR THAT WAS
ONCE OPEN WILL SWING
SHUT...A PATH YOU CHOSE
MIGHT TURN OUT TO BE THE
WRONG ONE.**

WRITTEN BY MEN AND WOMEN
WHO DID JUST THAT--WHO
REACHED THE STARS AFTER**

**FACING EARLY DEFEAT, OR WHO
WERE TOLD IT COULDN'T BE
DONE.**

**ONE OF THOSE MEN WAS A
FELLOW WHO FAILED
REPEATEDLY. HE LOST HIS
FIRST RACE FOR THE STATE
LEGISLATURE. WHEN AT LEAST
HE WAS ELECTED, HE RAN
TWICE FOR SPEAKER, AND WAS**

**DEFEATED BOTH TIMES. HE
WAS ELECTED TO CONGRESS,
BUT WAS DEFEATED FOR RE-
ELECTION. HE CAMPAIGNED
FOR HIS PARTY'S VICE-
PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATION AND
LOST. TWO YEARS LATER, HE
RAN FOR SENATE, AND WAS
DEFEATED.**

**AND TWO YEARS AFTER THAT
HE WAS ELECTED PRESIDENT OF
THE UNITED STATES. HIS NAME,
OF COURSE, WAS ABRAHAM
LINCOLN.**

**EVEN AS PRESIDENT,
LINCOLN AT FIRST SEEMED A
LOSER. THE UNION ARMIES MET
DEFEAT IN THE CRUCIAL EARLY
ENGAGEMENTS OF THE CIVIL**

**WAR. ONE GENERAL AFTER
ANOTHER WAS FIRED. IN
ENGLAND, THE MOST POWERFUL
NATION IN EUROPE, INFORMED
OPINION SIDED WITH THE
CONFEDERACY AND HELD THAT
IT WOULD BE ONLY A MATTER
OF MONTHS BEFORE THE
NORTH LOST THE WAR, AND THE**

CRUDE, BACKWOODS

PRESIDENT WAS FORGOTTEN.

**BUT THROUGHOUT HIS LIFE,
LINCOLN KNEW HE WAS IN THE
RIGHT AND HE PERSEVERED.**

SAVED THE UNION AND WON

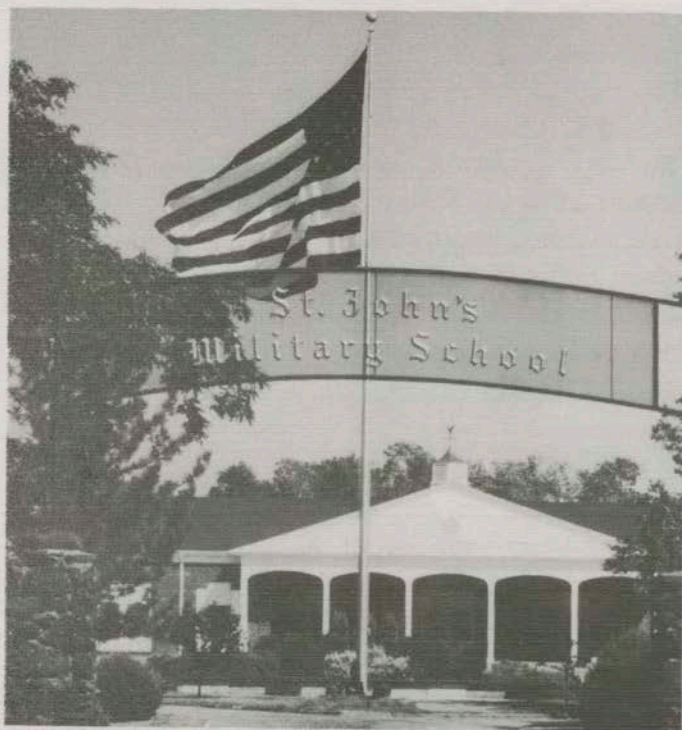

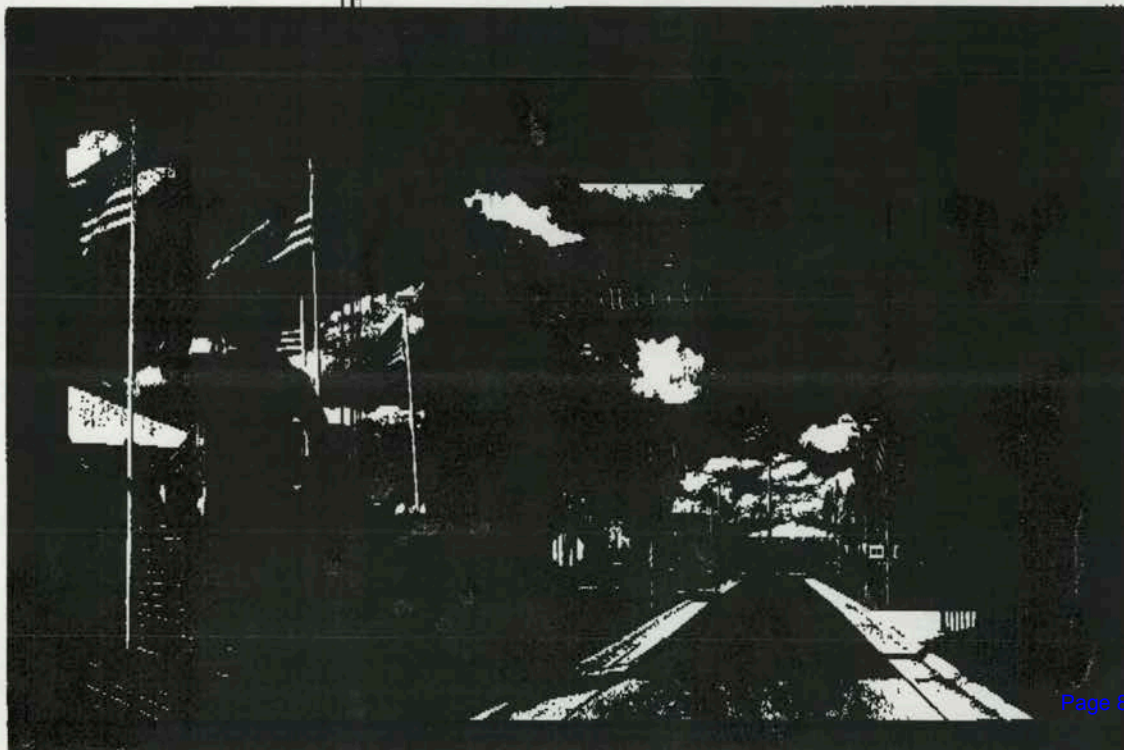


