Senator Dole --

Patrick Skain, of San Francisco, will be at the San Francisco County Republican luncheon June 2 and he wants to ask you a question about immigration.

He wrote the attached letter to give you advance warning. You can tell him we will be sending a more detailed reply but in the meantime:

-- The Executive Order he refers to was put in place to help refugees after the Tiananmen Square crackdown.

-- It really has no effect on the intentions of Chinese gangs to smuggle illegal aliens into this country. This smuggling is organized crime and should be treated as such.

-- Refugee status has been regularly given to citizens of countries whose lives are in danger because of a political situation at home -- China, Central America, former Soviet Union, Iran, etc. This status is withdrawn when the situation changes.

-- As a nation of immigrants, we are often strict with those who come later but the US remains a magnet for anyone trying to improve their lives.

-- Chinese aliens who are here should be allowed back into China as soon as possible. Some have already gone.

-- We shouldn't count refugees in emergency situations against regular quotas because they are two different situations.

Today, I received an invitation from the San Francisco Republican County Central Committee to attend an luncheon on June 2 at which you are to be the featured speaker. The announcement stated that audience questions will be answered by Senator Dole throughout the luncheon in an open dialogue format.

Since my question deals with Executive Order 12711 which was signed by President Bush on April 11, 1990 to establish a policy with respect to nationals of the People's Republic of China, I thought it best to raise the subject now.

The enclosed 13 page report on Chinese immigration was part of a 4 day series featured in the San Francisco Chronicle (April 27 - April 30). This report is a damning indictment of our current immigration policy and the total inability of our federal government to control our borders.


Because Executive Order 12711 directs "enhanced consideration" and therefore automatic admission into the United States by asylum applicants from the PRC, a dynamic has been established that encourages this massive migration.

Executive Order 12711 also deferred the enforced departure of all nationals of the PRC and their dependents who were in the United States on or after June 5, 1989. President Clinton is due to make a determination soon regarding the return of these individuals to China.

- Question: (1) Will you call for the total repeal of Executive Order 12711, and/or
- (2) will you urge the President to return all PRC nationals to China;

THIS CONSTITUENT IS ATTENDING A LUNCHEON ON TUESDAY WHERE THE
SENATOR IS GOING TO ANSWER QUESTIONS THROUGHOUT THE LUNCHEON.
THE CONSTITUENT WROTE IN TO POSE HIS QUESTION EARLY.

Executive Order 12711 was signed by President Bush on April 11,
1990. Its main points are:

- 1) defer enforced departure of all national of the PRC
and their dependents who were in the US on or after June 5, 1989
until January 1, 1994.
- 2) waive through January 1, 1994 the requirement of a
valid passport and to process and provide necessary documents,
both within the US and at US consulates overseas, to facilitate
travel across the borders of other nation and reentry into the US
in the same status such PRC nationals had upon departure.
- 3) The following protections are to be provided-
 - a) irrevocable waiver of the 2-year home country
residence requirement that be exercised until
Jan. 1, 1994.
 - b) maintenance of lawful status for purposes of
adjustment of status or change on nonimmigrant
status for such PRC nationals who were in lawful
status at any time on or after June 5, 1989.
 - c) authorization for employment through January 1,
1994.
 - d) notice of expiration of nonimmigrant status (if
applicable) rather than the institution of
deportation proceedings, and explanation of
options available for such PRC nationals
eligible for deferral of enforced departure
whose nonimmigrant status has expired.

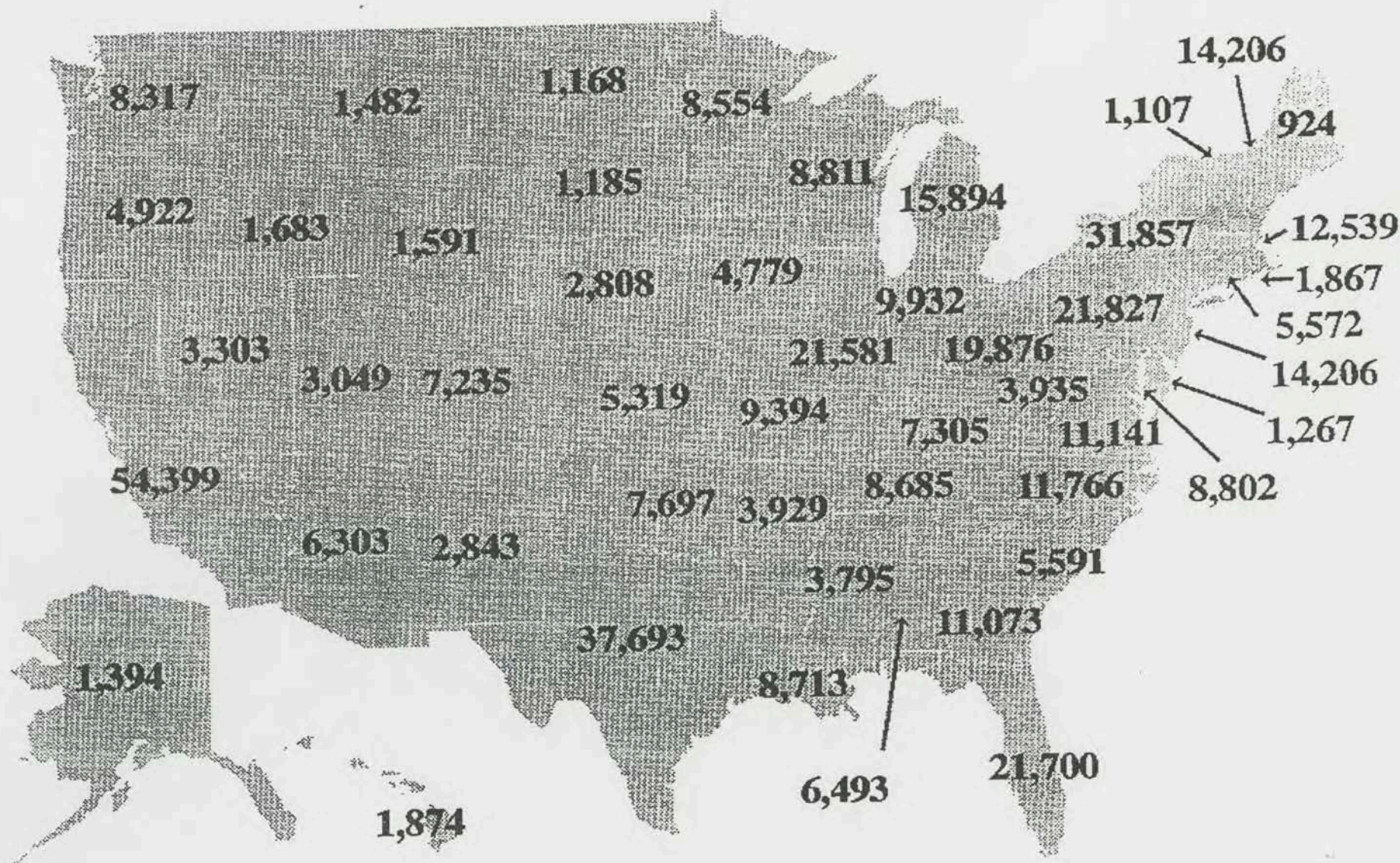
